University Community Service and Environmental Development Activities

First: Integrated Caravans

1- University Caravan to Qaramous Village, Sharqia Governorate

On Tuesday, May 21, 2024, the university organized a caravan to Qaramous Village in Abu Kabir District, Sharqia Governorate, in coordination with the governorate's Population Unit and the Regional Tourism Promotion Authority. Three faculties participated: the Faculty of Pharmacy, the Faculty of Oral and Dental Medicine, and the Faculty of Business Administration and International Trade.

At the beginning of the day, all participating faculty members, teaching assistants, and students visited a papyrus paper manufacturing workshop to observe the production process from seed to paper. They also visited fields where papyrus plants are cultivated.

Fifteen students from the first, fourth, and fifth years of the Faculty of Pharmacy, under the supervision of the Head of the Pharmacognosy Department and a pharmacy specialist, and with the participation of the Vice Dean for Community Service and Environmental Development, delivered an awareness lecture to the villagers about the use of medicinal plants and herbs and their side effects. At the end of the activity, some medicinal herbs were distributed to the villagers for their benefit. The Community Service and Environmental Development Committee of the Faculty of Oral and Dental Medicine, under the supervision of the Vice Dean for Community Service and Environmental Development, the Committee Coordinator, a supervisor from the Internship Training Department, a representative from the International Dental Federation, and a group of intern dentists, conducted a workshop at the medical center on improving oral and dental healthcare for staff, workers, and villagers. The workshop also demonstrated the correct technique for oral hygiene. One hundred and fifty (150) tubes of toothpaste and toothbrushes were distributed to villagers, who were also invited to receive free checkups and treatment at the university's dental clinic complex. At the end of the activity, satisfaction surveys were distributed to staff and participating villagers, with a 100% satisfaction rate. The intern dentists also expressed 100% satisfaction with the visit.

The village is known for its papyrus cultivation but lacks marketing opportunities. Therefore, a marketing instructor from the Faculty of Business Administration and International Trade, along with three students, conducted a lecture on product marketing for papyrus workshop owners, highlighting strategies for marketing papyrus and increasing sales. 5- University Commemorates the 50th Anniversary of the October 1973 Victories

The university organized a lecture entitled “The Egyptian-Israeli Conflict from 1967 to 1973 – Deception, Suffering, and Victory” on Wednesday, October 11, 2023, to commemorate the 50th anniversary of the October 1973 victory.

The lecture was delivered by Major General Ayman Hab El-Din, who participated in the 1967 War, the War of Attrition, and the 1973 War as commander of the 418th Air Defense Battalion.

The audience included university students and staff from all departments. The lecture covered the following:

- The deception tactics employed in the 1967 War.
- The suffering endured by the people and the army, and their resilience in the face of life's hardships, as they prepared the nation and the armed forces for war.
- How the nation's resources were mobilized to develop air defense capabilities and construct the missile defense system that neutralized the enemy's air superiority.
- The armed forces' organization of the crossing into Sinai and the achievement of victory. • He reviewed some of the difficulties he faced in leading Battalion 418 and shooting down 17 Israeli aircraft, making the battalion a model of air defense in the October War.

7- The University's participation for the third consecutive year in World Oral Health Day activities:

On Monday, March 4, 2024, the University participated in World Oral Health Day activities, organized in coordination with the World Health Organization and the World Dental Federation. Dr. Nahawand Thabet, a member of the World Dental Federation's Supreme Council and the African representative on the Council, was present, along with the student activity CDC. The activity and its date were recorded on the World Oral Health Day map.

University students and staff were educated about oral health. A booth was set up in the university courtyard, featuring numerous educational brochures, an informational board, and a display screen to raise awareness about oral and dental health, along with various recreational games. Another booth was set up by Helen Company, which distributed educational pamphlets to all participants. Students from the CDC (Center for Dental Activities) distributed toothbrushes and toothpaste donated by Signal Company, and educational brochures were distributed to all students and university staff attending the event. The activities also included raising awareness among patients visiting the dental clinic complex, distributing toothpaste, brushes, and oral health guides in the clinic's waiting area.

A World Health Organization video was shown on screens within the clinic complex, as well as on a screen next to the booth where the events were held and on the main university building. At the end of the day, the university presented Dr. Nahawand Thabet with a plaque in celebration of World Oral Health Day. In celebration of Oral Health Day, and following the conclusion of the event, members of the student club (CDC) distributed questionnaires to assess participants' satisfaction, including:

1– University students' satisfaction

A number of university students from various colleges expressed their satisfaction with the different activities held to celebrate World Oral Health Day. The overall student satisfaction rate reached 95%. Event organization achieved the highest satisfaction rate at 93.5%, followed by the awareness campaign and educational and illustrative materials at 91%.

2- Patient Satisfaction at the Dental Clinic Complex

Fifty-seven patients visiting the university's dental clinics completed the questionnaires. Participants ranged in age from 8 to 76 years, with 61.4% being female. Regarding the occupational distribution of these patients, approximately half of the responses (45.6%) came from housewives, 15.8% from skilled trades and professions, 8.9% from office work or prestigious professions, 22.8% from students, and 7% from retirees.

1. Times Higher Education Rankings Grants Misr International University a Distinguished Position for the Fifth Year

Misr International University has achieved a significant milestone, ranking among the world's best universities in the Times Higher Education World University Rankings for the fifth consecutive year. Misr International University was ranked among the institutions contributing most to the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), placing in the 1001-1500 range out of 2,152 universities from 125 countries worldwide.

The university ranked 401-600 in achieving SDG 3 (Good Health and Well-being), 401-600 in achieving SDG 6 (Clean Water and Sanitation), 401-600 in achieving SDG 16 (Peace, Justice and Strong Institutions), and 1001-1500 in achieving SDG 17 (Partnerships for Sustainable Development).

This ranking achieved by Misr International University highlights the commitment of its faculty, staff, and students to working towards the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals and enhances the university's global standing.

Second: Webometrics Ranking

Misr International University appears in the Webometrics Ranking for the second consecutive year. This ranking aims to improve universities' online presence and promote open access to the information, research, and knowledge published by the university. The ranking is based on three main criteria: Visibility, which measures the impact of the university's website content through its external networks; Openness, which measures the number of researchers cited by the top 310 researchers globally; and Excellence, which measures the number of research papers cited among the top 10% of research papers in 27 different disciplines within the database over the previous five years.

The following table shows the university's overall global, national, and regional rankings for 2022 and 2023. The results indicate a slight improvement in the university's ranking at the global, national, and African levels, while its ranking declined slightly at the Arab world and Middle East level.

3. The Ministry of Higher Education and Scientific Research announces a competition for the largest television program in the fields of entrepreneurship, innovation, and scientific research (the Gen-Z Program Competition) for students of Egyptian universities and institutes, and the university's participation in it.

The Ministry of Higher Education and Scientific Research, in cooperation with the United Media Services Company, announced on Saturday, September 30, 2023, a competition for the largest television program in the fields of entrepreneurship, innovation, and scientific research (the Gen-Z Program Competition) for students of Egyptian universities and institutes.

The competition aims to spread a culture of innovation and entrepreneurship among students and encourage innovative students and entrepreneurs in Egyptian universities across all scientific disciplines to establish their own startups. It targets students with innovative ideas or community initiatives that address challenges and meet market needs. The competition offers prizes totaling 100 million Egyptian pounds and provides financial support to each eligible team, assisting them in establishing startups based on innovative ideas. Participating teams also have the opportunity to attend a range of training programs focused on management and finance, as well as mentoring and guidance sessions.

- The President of Enactus MIU student club, comprised of nine pharmacy students, presented their project "Roti," a nutritionally complete food product (200g sachet, costing between 8 and 10 Egyptian pounds) designed for children from low-income families.

The project did not advance to the second stage. The same project had previously been submitted to the Egypt National Competition Enactus the previous year, where it achieved sixth place out of 100 participating projects.

- Pharmacy students Mohamed Mahmoud Ezz El-Din and Mohamed Ashraf Tawfik participated with a project called "Powder," which aims to produce potable water using a device consisting of three parts. The first part collects moisture from the air using a series of fans. The second part contains condensers that condense this moisture-rich air into potable water. The final part is a solar panel that provides the electricity needed to power the condensers. The project reached the second stage. Previously, they participated with the same project in the Arab Youth Hackathon, sponsored by Pepsi-Cola, where they won first place. They are scheduled to travel with the company to represent Egypt at COP28, the climate conference in Dubai in December.

4. Launching Research Competitions to Celebrate the Golden Jubilee of the Glorious October Victories for All Students, Faculty Members, and Teaching Assistants

Based on the directives of the Secretary of the Council of Private Universities regarding launching research competitions to celebrate the Golden Jubilee of the Glorious October Victories for all students, faculty members, and teaching assistants, an email was sent to the students, and a graduating student from [unspecified institution] submitted [an application/committee/etc.]. The Faculty of Information and Computer Science submitted the required research, which was then sent to both the Secretary of the Council of Private Universities and the Acting Permanent Undersecretary of the Ministry of Higher Education and Scientific Research.

5. The University's Appearance in the 2023 Stanford University Rankings: Two Faculty Members from the Faculty of Information and Computer Science Selected Among the Top 2% of Influential Scientists Worldwide

On Thursday, October 12, 2023, Stanford University in the United States announced the selection of two faculty members from the Faculty of Information and Computer Science among the top 2% of influential scientists worldwide in the 2023 Stanford University Rankings. The faculty members are Professor Dr. Islam Amer and Assistant Professor Dr. Diaan Salama.

This ranking includes 160,000 researchers out of 8 million academic researchers across 22 majors and 176 sub-majors. The ranking is based on the Scopus database. The evaluation relies on a composite index known as the C-score, which includes the number of citations of each researcher's research and the H-index. Citation Index in the discipline.

9. Report on the First Misr International University Conference on Sustainable Development Goals

On Saturday, February 17, 2024, Misr International University organized its first conference on the 2030 Sustainable Development Goals at the university campus. The conference, titled "Towards a Sustainable Future: Innovations, Challenges, and Opportunities," is part of the university's efforts to

raise awareness of the importance of sustainable development and contribute to enhancing its ranking in the Times Higher Education World University Rankings, which are based on universities' contributions to achieving the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals.

The conference witnessed active participation from university professors, students, and graduates, in addition to participants from universities and educational and research institutions such as the American University in Cairo, Ain Shams University, Alexandria University, the Egyptian Drug Authority, the National Research Centre, the Ministry of Communications and Information Technology, and the Young Leaders Foundation. The sessions featured scientific research presentations addressing various aspects of sustainable development and its goals.

The conference was attended by prominent figures in several fields who contributed valuable insights and guidance to support the university's journey toward achieving greater excellence and success in realizing the Sustainable Development Goals. Among the attendees were Professor Mohamed Diao Zein El Abdeen, President of Ain Shams University; Professor Abdel Nasser Sangab, a member of the tripartite committee managing the affairs of the Pharmacists Syndicate; Professor Ayman El Khatib, Vice President of the Egyptian Drug Authority; professors from the National Research Centre; and specialists in strategy and sustainability from Giza Systems, a leading company in enabling digital transformation.

Among the most prominent issues highlighted by the conference was the importance of integrating the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) into academic curricula and the necessity of developing leadership, decision-making, and problem-solving skills among students to empower them to serve society effectively. The conference sessions also addressed environmentally friendly practices implemented by the university and government agencies across all sectors.

The conference encouraged researchers to conduct interdisciplinary studies and strive to address various SDGs, not necessarily those directly related to their specific fields of study.

The conference contributed to raising awareness of the importance of sustainable development and the university's role in achieving it by showcasing the university's achievements and successful experiences in responding to numerous goals. It also provided a platform for exchanging knowledge and expertise among researchers in different fields.

The conference presented important recommendations aimed at supporting the university's efforts in achieving the SDGs and enhancing its standing in relevant international rankings. Among the suggestions made by attendees was the need to hold this conference annually due to its significant impact on guiding the educational process and scientific research in service of society.

On the sidelines of the conference, the university hosted an exhibition for graduates and students to promote their handicrafts, clothing, and accessories, aiming to foster entrepreneurship and encourage initiative among students by supporting their small businesses. A survey was sent to conference participants to gauge their satisfaction, and the results were overwhelmingly positive, with attendees expressing their high level of satisfaction with the sessions and event organization.

Fourth: University Crisis Management Committee

A: Precautionary Measures by the University's Occupational Safety and Health Department

- On the occasion of the start of the 2023/2024 academic year, a meeting was held with the cafeteria managers to ensure compliance with occupational safety and health procedures in the cafeterias. This meeting took place on Wednesday, September 13, 2023, and a report on the meeting's success was sent to the university administration.
- New forms for monitoring university fire extinguishers were distributed on Sunday, September 10, 2023, to all university buildings for use during the 2023/2024 academic year.
- An awareness session was conducted by the Occupational Safety and Health Department on Tuesday, September 12, 2023, for university workers to raise awareness about occupational safety and health within the buildings. A report on the session's success was sent to the university administration.
- The Occupational Safety and Health Department developed a traffic plan and a training plan for university technicians and workers for the 2023/2024 academic year. A copy of these plans was sent to the university administration. - Based on a request from the Quality Assurance Center dated September 25, 2023, a copy of the fire extinguisher inventory list for the university, along with the training plan for university technicians and workers, and the emergency and evacuation plan for all university buildings, was sent to the university office.
- Protective equipment was distributed to the university's skilled workers on September 27, 2023, by the Maintenance Department Manager.
- The monthly inspection of the university for September was conducted by the Occupational Safety and Health Department according to the annual inspection plan.
- The monthly inspection of the university for October was conducted by the Occupational Safety and Health Department according to the annual inspection plan.
- A request was submitted on Wednesday, November 1, 2023, to the Faculty of Media to prepare an evacuation video for the university buildings, as it is required as documentation for conducting evacuation drills.
- An awareness segment on how to act in earthquake situations was sent on Wednesday, November 1, 2023, to the university's Crisis Management Committee for distribution to university students. - The Qalyubia Governorate Health Committee visited the university's drinking water tanks on Monday,

November 6, 2023. The following observations were made to the Maintenance Department Director regarding the disinfection of the drinking water tanks:

- The company responsible for disinfecting the drinking water tanks must be affiliated with the Qalyubia Governorate to ensure its oversight during the disinfection process, as the current company is based in Giza Governorate.
- The drinking water tanks must be disinfected monthly.
- On Wednesday, November 8, 2023, a foam fire extinguisher, which will be replaced by a new one from Bavaria Company, was used to train nine (9) generator station personnel on how to use it to extinguish diesel fuel tank fires. The training was filmed.
- The following training courses were conducted by the Occupational Safety and Health Department, and a success report was submitted to the university administration:

The foam fire extinguishers were delivered to the Maintenance Department Manager.
- The Engineering Department manufactured eight (8) red-painted metal boxes to protect the foam fire extinguishers from the elements, as requested by the Occupational Safety and Health Department.
- The monthly inspection of the university was conducted by the Occupational Safety and Health Department in November, according to the annual inspection plan.
- A copy of the training courses conducted by the Occupational Safety and Health Department during the 2021/2022 academic year was sent to Ms. Wafaa, the University President's Secretary, at her request.
- Instructions for securing and handling gas cylinders in the workers' accommodation were issued on December 21, 2023, and a copy was sent to the University Administration. - A letter dated December 27, 2023, was sent to the Public Relations Department requesting approval for the disbursement of (5) gifts to the Occupational Safety and Health Administration Office in Obour City, which is affiliated with the university. The disbursement has not yet taken place.
- The monthly inspection of the university for December was conducted by the Occupational Safety and Health Administration, in accordance with the annual inspection plan.
- The monthly inspection of the university for January 2024 was conducted by the Occupational Safety and Health Administration, in accordance with the annual inspection plan.
- A request was submitted on Monday, February 5, 2024, to the Engineering Department regarding the urgent need to construct an emergency exit at the basement of the Faculty of Oral and Dental Medicine, as there is a locked iron door on the patient corridor.

Second Semester, Spring 2024

- On the occasion of the end of the first semester of the 2023/2024 academic year, the Occupational Safety and Health Administration's achievements report for the first semester was sent to you.
- Student violation statistics for the first semester of the 2023/2024 academic year were sent to the University's Quality Assurance Center on February 7, 2024.
- First aid supplies were delivered and replenished to the Faculty of Pharmacy laboratories for the laboratory technicians to ensure laboratory operations on February 7, 2024.
- Instructions were issued and implemented for securing the university's employment tent, which was erected on Saturday, February 24, 2024, with various safety measures in place to protect against emergencies and fires. These measures were carried out by the Occupational Safety and Health Department.
- The monthly inspection of the university for February 2024 was conducted by the Occupational Safety and Health Department, in accordance with the annual inspection plan.
- On March 5, 2024, the following requests were submitted to the university administration for approval:
 - Approval to begin the process of renewing the university's Civil Defense and Fire Plan.
 - Approval to replace and maintain the 16 25 kg dry powder fire extinguishers across the university due to corrosion of some connections and their age.
 - Approval to conduct training courses for some university staff members at the National Center for Occupational Safety and Health Studies. Approval is currently pending.
- Security instructions were issued and implemented for the university's breakfast event on Tuesday, March 26, 2024, at the new university campus.
- The monthly inspection for March 2024 was conducted by the Occupational Safety and Health Department according to the annual inspection plan.
- On April 7, 2024, university security instructions were issued to building managers during the Eid al-Fitr holiday.
- On April 23, 2024, university security instructions were issued to building and department managers during the spring break, from April 25 to May 6, 2024.
- The monthly inspection for April 2024 was conducted by the Occupational Safety and Health Department according to the annual inspection plan.
- On May 8, 2024, first aid supplies were completed in the Faculty of Pharmacy laboratories in preparation for the practical exams.

- On May 15, 2024, security instructions were issued to laboratory technicians for the Faculty of Pharmacy laboratories after the completion of the practical exams. - The monthly inspection for May 2024 was conducted at the university by the Occupational Safety and Health Department, in accordance with the annual inspection plan.

 - Emergency Procedures and Disaster Response course for Pharmacy and Dentistry technicians on June 12, 2024. - A training course on fire prevention methods and how to use a portable fire extinguisher for security personnel and new employees, held on June 26, 2024.
 - A training course on how to handle cleaning materials and safety procedures during bathroom cleaning for university cleaning staff, held on June 26, 2024.
- The monthly inspection for June 2024 was conducted at the university by the Occupational Safety and Health Department, in accordance with the annual inspection plan.
- The semi-annual statistics were approved by the Safety Office in Al-Obour, to which the university is affiliated, up to June 30, 2024.
- The monthly inspection for July 2024 was conducted at the university by the Occupational Safety and Health Department, in accordance with the annual inspection plan.

B: University Medical Sector Precautionary Measures

First: Crisis Management:

- Addressing, preparing for, and responding to crises and emergencies is a top priority for the medical sector.
- The college's Crisis and Disaster Management Unit operates according to the National Crisis Management System as follows:
 - A trained medical team is present.
 - Two fully equipped clinics are designated for medical examinations of students and university staff.
 - Cooperation with the Egyptian Ambulance Authority and the provision of a fully equipped ambulance with its trained medical crew.
 - All necessary emergency medications and supplies are available, as well as two defibrillators and an oxygen cylinder.

Second: Clinic Operations and Precautionary Measures Continue:

- Continuous monitoring of the clinic's email to receive reports of student illnesses.
- Taking the necessary health measures for all patients.
- Providing medical follow-up for each patient according to their individual needs. • In case of suspected infectious disease, the clinic will notify the patient immediately (via email or phone) not to come to the university to expedite necessary procedures until recovery and submission of proof of recovery.

Third: Emergency Health Services:

- Providing urgent medical services.
- Transporting injured or ill individuals to hospitals with the assistance and supervision of the medical team.
- Providing medical follow-up for injured or ill individuals both in hospitals and after their return to the university.

C: Security Management Precautionary Measures

Security management procedures are divided into several scopes as follows:

- First Scope: Individual Entry Through University Gates

- 1- Thermal cameras will display the temperature of employees upon entry through the gates. In case of elevated temperature, an audible and visual alert will be issued via the thermal monitoring screen located at the gates.
- 2- Thermal cameras display students' temperatures upon entry through the gates. In case of elevated temperature, an audible and visual alarm is triggered via the thermal monitoring screen located at the gates.
- 3- Temperatures are manually measured by security personnel at the main vehicle gate for vehicle occupants.

Second Scope: Handling Individuals with Medical Conditions Prohibited from Entering the University

- 1- Lists of individuals prohibited from entering the university are received from the Medical Department, which then informs the IT Department to deactivate the individual's gate card.
- 2- All data and photos of these individuals are printed by the Security Department and distributed to gate security personnel to ensure compliance with the entry ban.
- 3- When sick students arrive with their medical documents, gate security personnel inform the Medical Department and escort the student to the Medical Department to submit their documents.

Third Scope: Interacting with Students on Campus

- 1- Security personnel are present at the gates and throughout the campus to assist and guide students and faculty members.
- 2- In case of any problems between students, security personnel will intervene and direct them to the security office.

Procedures taken to respond to earthquakes and crises:

- 1- Directing individuals outside buildings to designated assembly areas.
- 2- Assisting in transporting the injured to medical points.

- 3- Preventing individuals from re-entering buildings.
- 4- Preventing individuals from approaching any collapsed or potentially collapsing buildings.
- 5- Assisting in extinguishing any fires that may occur because of the earthquake.
- 6- Escorting individuals on buses for evacuation outside the university.
- 7- The security department participated in evacuation drills for students and staff in all university academic buildings and the clinics building, in accordance with the university's plan to train students and staff on safe and proper evacuation for the 2022/2023 academic year.
- 8- During the closure of the pedestrian bridge due to partial damage caused by a road accident on June 20, 2023, the university security administration used university vehicles on both sides of the road, under the supervision of security personnel, to transport students, faculty members, and patients to and from the designated student waiting area until repairs were completed and the bridge reopened.

D: College-Specific Precautionary Measures

1- College of Oral and Dental Medicine

In its commitment to monitoring the implementation of the Crisis and Disaster Management Committee's work and the established action plan, the Community Service and Environmental Development Department has followed up on the following recommendations:

- Raising student awareness of the importance of following instructions displayed on screens throughout the college.
- Raising awareness of ethical conduct and behavior, particularly in dental clinics.
- Promoting the prohibition of smoking and the requirement for students to wear appropriate attire on campus.
- Ensuring adherence to infection control precautionary measures.
- Proposing activities to protect the environment and the climate.
- Providing training to faculty members, their assistants, staff, and students on fire safety procedures.

Furthermore, ensuring the implementation of all procedures for crisis and disaster management in classrooms, clinics, and laboratories, and the enforcement of infection control precautionary measures through the following departments:

1. Internship Training Department
2. Continuing Education Committee
3. Education and Student Affairs Department
4. Postgraduate Studies and Scientific Research Department
5. University Clinics Complex
6. Infection Prevention and Control Department
7. Building (S).
8. Laboratories Department.
9. Occupational Safety and Health Department.

The activities undertaken by each department were monitored to ensure the implementation of the plan set for the 2023-2024 academic year, as follows:

First: Internship Training Department

The interns' adherence to infection control guidelines was monitored to ensure their safety and the safety of patients in the clinics. This was achieved through:

- Training new interns on infection prevention and control procedures and occupational health before their training within the university clinic complex.
- Supervising interns during their training at the university clinic complex.

A digital transformation plan was also developed to reduce paperwork in the Internship Department office. This plan included two components:

1. Receiving applications for the training year electronically, not on paper.
2. Copying all paper files stored in the department office from previous years and uploading them to the department's network system.
3. A representative from the Internship Training Department attended the Crisis and Disaster Management Committee meetings at the Faculty of Oral and Dental Medicine to discuss all matters related to maintaining the safety of interns and to follow up on the annual plan for the 2023-2024 training year.

Second: The Continuing Education Committee

The Continuing Education Committee took all the following precautionary measures:

- Trainees in all continuing education programs were divided into groups.
- All precautionary measures were taken when distributing trainees within the clinics complex.
- Trainees were monitored within the clinics complex to ensure adherence to all precautionary measures.
- Upon the appearance of a confirmed or suspected case of COVID-19 among trainees, the university administration was notified to take the necessary action regarding the trainee's absence.
- A mechanism was put in place to ensure the safety of trainees, faculty members, teaching assistants, and nurses during clinical training and direct patient interaction within the clinics complex.

Third: Student Affairs and Education

The college has taken the following measures to ensure the implementation of the Crisis and Disaster Management Committee's work and the established action plan:

- o Reminding students of the importance of adhering to infection control protocols to ensure their safety and the safety of patients.
- o Implementing all necessary precautionary measures when assigning students to classrooms and laboratories.
- o Tasking academic departments with uploading course materials and manuals to the university's online platform.
- o Taking all necessary steps to develop the college's e-learning content. The e-learning unit continued to provide technical support for the e-learning platform in collaboration with e-learning focus groups in each academic department.
- o Continuing to implement formative assessment.
- o Academic departments continued to create question banks for all courses.
- o A mechanism was established to ensure the safety of students, faculty members, and nurses during clinical training and direct patient contact in the outpatient clinic.

Fourth: Graduate Studies and Scientific Research Department

In its commitment to implementing the established plan, the Graduate Studies and Scientific Research Department has taken the following measures:

- o Reminding graduate students of the importance of taking all necessary preventive measures.
- o Emphasizing to faculty members and teaching assistants at the Clinics and Laboratories Complex the importance of adhering to infection control protocols to ensure their safety and the safety of patients.

Fifth: University Clinics Complex

The Clinics Complex has taken the following measures to ensure the implementation of the Crisis and Disaster Management Committee's work and the established action plan:

Occupational Safety and Health

The Clinics Complex's emergency plan has been updated.

Awareness sessions have been held on prevention, disinfection, and sterilization procedures in the clinics.

3- Coordination has been established with the Occupational Safety and Health Department to conduct awareness sessions on crisis and disaster response.

4- Coordination has been established with the Occupational Safety and Health Department to conduct training sessions on how to respond to fires and use fire extinguishers.

Precautionary Measures Report

1. Workers and nursing staff were trained on proper disinfection techniques.
2. All necessary disinfection materials and equipment were provided.
3. Dettol was provided for disinfecting restrooms.
4. Disinfection schedule and responsibilities:

Sixth: Infection Prevention and Control Management

The Infection Prevention and Control Department has taken the following measures to ensure the implementation of the Crisis and Disaster Management Committee's work and the established action plan:

1. Ensuring the availability of a sufficient number of the updated form for reporting incidents of exposure to bloodborne viruses (at least 10 copies in Arabic and 10 copies in English) at the clinic and that its location is known to all staff.
2. Completing the registration and statistical process for all needlestick injury reports received by the department, along with providing recommendations and scientific advice to those exposed.
3. Regularly monitoring infection prevention and control procedures and taking any necessary corrective actions.
4. Training specialized administrators on the instrument disinfection and sterilization plan and adherence to sterilization assurance procedures on November 1, 2023, as part of infection prevention and control and occupational health procedures.
5. Training new resident physicians on infection prevention and control and occupational health procedures on January 2, 2024.

6. The Hepatitis B vaccination schedule and program were completed according to the vaccination plan, with a vaccination campaign being conducted from the Youth Health Center in Obour. A total of 34 doses were administered.
7. Preparations were made for the periodic training of nurses, their assistants, and specialized administrators, covering infection prevention and control and occupational health, during the mid-year break.
8. All inactive autoclaves in the clinics were tested and put back into operation after their efficiency was verified and they were tested to ensure they could handle the required number of instruments and sterilize them.
9. 163 new interns were trained on July 3, 2024, on infection prevention and control and occupational health procedures.
10. Three nursing supervisors from the clinic complex were trained on February 5, 2024, on infection prevention and control and occupational health procedures related to the clinic sterilization units.
11. The Procurement Department was contacted to provide the required doses of the Hepatitis B vaccine to complete the vaccination program. 12. The second week of September 2024 was designated for periodic training for nurses, their assistants, and specialized administrators, covering infection prevention and control and occupational health.

The Infection Control Department issued several recommendations to ensure the continued optimal achievement of its objectives:

1. Emphasize the necessity of adhering to standard precautions and wearing appropriate personal protective equipment when dealing with patients and when exposed to contaminated instruments or surfaces.
2. Establish a communication mechanism with relevant departments regarding needlestick injuries to minimize exposure.
3. Take appropriate measures to prevent shortages of infection prevention and occupational health supplies, such as specific tests to confirm the effectiveness of sterilization autoclaves in clinics.
4. Require consultation with the Infection Prevention and Control Department before making any decisions regarding infection prevention and control within the clinics complex.
5. Ensure that no infection prevention and control supplies are present without prior inspection by the department responsible.

6. Adhere to the scheduled sterilization dates for instruments and begin sterilization according to the established dates, not before, to avoid wasting sterilization resources.
7. Take appropriate measures to prevent shortages of infection control and occupational health supplies, such as equipment for cleaning and washing instruments, floor soap, autoclave testing kits, instrument storage containers, and instrument soaking filters.
8. Consult the Infection Prevention and Control Department before making any decisions regarding infection prevention and control procedures within the clinics.
9. Inform the Infection Prevention and Control Department of any new equipment supplied for use in the clinics well in advance of its use. This allows nurses to be informed and trained on proper cleaning, disinfection, and sterilization procedures, and to ensure that single-use instruments are not reused.

Seventh: Building (S)

To implement the established plan, the building (S) administration has taken the following measures:

- Staff have been trained on the correct disinfection method.
- All necessary disinfection materials and equipment have been provided.
- Dettol has been provided for disinfecting the restrooms. - The laboratories and computer labs were disinfected with diluted chlorine between rooms, with windows opened for ventilation.
- A complete disinfection was carried out using a dedicated sprayer, covering all corridors, stairwells, and door handles.

Eighth: Laboratory Management

To implement the plan developed for dealing with crises and disasters and to maintain occupational safety and health, the following measures have been taken by the Laboratory Management:

First: For Students:

- Students are not permitted to enter the laboratory unless they wear a lab coat.
- Student entry and exit to the laboratories are being organized as much as possible to prevent overcrowding.

- A handwashing sink has been designated in each laboratory for students, and hand soap is provided.
- Students are not permitted to use natural teeth in the laboratories unless they have been sterilized and disinfected by a qualified technician.
- Sterilized teeth will be collected and returned at specific times to prevent overcrowding.
- Students are not permitted to be in the laboratory outside of teaching hours to ensure cleanliness and maintain sterilization.
- A maximum number of students is allowed in the X-ray room.
- A maximum number of students is allowed in the preparation and return rooms.
- Continuous instructions are given to maintain social distancing.

Second: For Technicians:

- Each lab technician must always wear a lab coat.
- Hand hygiene and regular washing are essential.
- Social distancing from students must be maintained as much as possible.
- No instruments, equipment, reagents, or measurements should be received from clinics until they have been sterilized in the infection control room. These items should then be forwarded to the appropriate lab.
- If possible, dummy heads should be rotated between labs.
- All lab technicians must attend a workshop titled "Principles of General Laboratory Safety/Biosafety" to learn about various sterilization and safety methods, proper handling of chemicals, and how to respond in case of emergencies. The workshop was conducted under the supervision of Dr. Hanan Al-Mohammadi.

Third: For Labs:

- Continuous ventilation of all labs is essential.
- Tools used in each lab should be disinfected by spraying them with alcohol after each use. • All surfaces will be sanitized after each lab session by cleaning staff.
- All chairs will be sanitized and floors mopped after each lab session by cleaning staff.

- A camera will be provided to help prevent overcrowding during practical sessions. Faculty members will present their lessons via the camera, and the images will be displayed to students on LCD screens in the labs.

- This is in addition to all the precautionary measures generally followed in Building S.

A workshop was also organized for the college's laboratory technicians, presented by Dr. Hanan Al-Muhammadi in the lecture hall of the Internship Training Department at 9:30 AM.

The workshop was attended by 22 laboratory technicians from student labs, research labs, and specialized labs. It covered three main topics:

1. Basic and initial training on laboratory safety.
2. Bloodborne pathogens.
3. Laboratory-acquired infections.

Attendees expressed their satisfaction by completing the workshop evaluation questionnaires, achieving a 100% satisfaction rate.



Proposed Improvement Measures for the Spring 2024 Semester:

- Continue to educate all technicians on infection control procedures and methods through lectures and workshops.
- Educate first- and second-year students on all procedures for handling materials and equipment in laboratories, in addition to infection control measures.
- Assign specialized staff to sterilize equipment and provide a suitable area for cleaning and sterilization.
- Mark seating arrangements for students in laboratories without simulation units to maintain social distancing. These markings should be placed in the following laboratories:

S14, S15, S24, S25, S26, S28, S29, S30, S46, and S47.

- Provide larger quantities of tissues and hand sanitizer in the laboratories to cover the use of technicians, faculty members (and students, if possible).
- Increase the number of tools and equipment used to facilitate the disinfection process between laboratories.
- Provide/install a transparent barrier at the laboratory technician's office to prevent the spread of infection.
- Establish a time gap between consecutive laboratories, if possible, to allow for the sterilization and disinfection of the laboratory and equipment.

Ninth: Occupational Safety and Health Management

The Occupational Safety and Health Management Department updated the Immediate Response, Emergency, and Crisis Plan for the Faculty of Oral and Dental Medicine building through the following procedures:

- Develop a plan to ensure the implementation of an organized and complete evacuation of the Faculty of Oral and Dental Medicine building in the event of an emergency.

The plan's main objectives include evacuation instructions and the duties of faculty members, staff, and students in emergency situations.

- Develop an evacuation plan for students and faculty staff, including evacuation teams for each floor.
- Establish an emergency team structure, dividing it into an evacuation team, a firefighting team, and a rescue team, and defining the required qualifications and assigned tasks for each team.

2- Faculty of Alsun and Mass Communication

1. A poster was created as part of an advertising campaign to protect the environment from pollution, and another poster was created to prevent road accidents, by teaching assistants in the Media Department.
2. Informational signs promoting a clean environment were created by Media Department students in the Advertising and Layout course and donated to orphanages and public primary schools.
3. An awareness video on how to yield the right-of-way to an ambulance was created by a Media Department student and donated to the Egyptian Ambulance Authority.
4. A poster for an advertising campaign to protect the environment from pollution and another poster to prevent road accidents, both designed by teaching assistants in the Media Department, were sent to university students via the university's social media platforms.
5. Informational signs promoting a clean environment and avoiding drinking from plastic bottles were donated by Media Department students in the Advertising and Layout course to the Mustafa Asaker Mosque Association for Girls' Welfare.



6. A draft cooperation agreement was prepared between the Faculty of Alsun and Mass Communication and the Egyptian Ambulance Authority, to be implemented starting in the 2024/2025 academic year.
 7. A first aid workshop was held for students of the Alsun and Mass Communication departments, titled "First Aid and How to Act in Emergencies." The workshop was presented by Professor Dr. Fatouh Hassanin from the Faculty of Pharmacy and Director of Emergency Care at Misr International University on Wednesday, April 24, 2024.
- The workshop topic is crucial for promoting first aid awareness among students.

- Dr. Fatouh highlighted the importance of being prepared to deal with emergencies, emphasizing that anyone can need immediate medical assistance. Students learned about potential risks and the necessary steps to address them.
- At the end of the workshop, students received practical training in the steps required to perform cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) for adults.
- The first aid workshop aligns with the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals, specifically Goal 4, "Quality Education." • Organizing this workshop underscores the college's commitment to promoting holistic education that equips students with practical life skills.

The delegation included 22 interns and faculty members from the Departments of Oral Medicine and Endodontics, as well as representatives from the FDI (Federation of International Dental Associations).

The visit aimed to raise awareness among the blind women, staff, and caregivers at the association regarding proper oral hygiene techniques.

The interns conducted examinations for all association staff members under the supervision of faculty members from the Departments of Oral Medicine and Endodontics. The interns held the hands of the blind women individually to guide them on the correct brushing technique. Food supplies were purchased and delivered to the association. An FDI representative also distributed 150 toothbrushes and toothpaste to all the visually impaired women and staff members examined.

Questionnaires were distributed to staff and caregivers at the Al-Nour Wal-Amal Association for Blind Women to identify their dental health needs, evaluate the program provided, and measure their satisfaction with the visit.

The satisfaction rate with the treatment provided was 100%.

• The Al-Nour Wal-Amal Association for Blind Women's visit to the clinics complex at the Faculty of Oral and Dental Medicine was organized by the Community Service and Environmental Development Department at the Faculty of Oral and Dental Medicine on Wednesday, January 3, 2024. Twenty-four intern dentists examined and treated 15 blind women and 12 of their companions in the clinics, based on their prior diagnoses during the association's visit on Tuesday, December 19, 2023. The director of the clinics complex, along with faculty members and their assistants from various scientific disciplines, were present.

2. Field Visits to Dar Al-Sondos Orphanage for Children with Disabilities.

On the sidelines of World Oral Health Day, the Community Service and Environmental Development Committee at the Faculty of Oral and Dental Medicine, Misr International University, organized a field visit for dental interns to Dar Al-Sondos Orphanage for Children with Disabilities in New Cairo on February 15, 2024. The visit included 40 dental interns and faculty members from the Departments of Oral Medicine and Endodontics, as well as members of the Federation of International Dental Associations (FDI).

The aim of the visit was to raise awareness among caregivers and staff at the orphanage regarding oral and dental health. An awareness session was conducted by the dental interns to explain the importance of teeth cleaning and proper oral hygiene techniques.

The dental interns examined all the children and staff members at the orphanage under the supervision of faculty members and invited them all to receive necessary treatment free of charge at the college's

clinics. Food supplies were also purchased and delivered to the orphanage. An FDI staff member distributed 150 toothbrushes and toothpaste to all the children, caregivers, and staff members examined at the orphanage.

Questionnaires were distributed to staff and caregivers to identify their dental health needs, evaluate the program provided, and measure their satisfaction with the visit.

The following are details of the activities:

a. Internship Training Management Report for the Fall 2023 Training Term

- The application form for interns graduating in July and September 2023 was prepared, and a meeting was held via Microsoft Teams for new interns to introduce them to the training year and its procedures. All interns will begin their training year on October 1, 2023, at various training locations, including

government universities, hospitals, Ministry of Health centers, and within the university clinic complex for those who wish to participate.

- Internship applications were received via the management's email. The team drafted, reviewed, and approved the letters with the approval of the Director of the Management and the Dean of the College, according to the interns' preferences. The letters were then delivered to the interns sequentially at the Internship Management office.
- In accordance with the principle of transparency followed by the Internship Training Department and given the limited training positions available for interns within the university clinics complex, it was decided to accept interns for training within the university by dividing the cohort according to their cumulative grade point average. Interns were required to apply electronically over a four-day period, and those who applied were accepted based on the order in which their applications were submitted. This ensures integrity and fairness and adheres to anti-corruption regulations.
- Internal memos were sent to the Recruitment Department, the Certificates Department, the Graduates Office, and the Clinics Complex, informing them of the names of the new cohort and their expected start and end dates, so they could take the necessary action.
- Letters of assignment were issued to 316 interns who graduated in July and September 2023 for various departments.
- Interns were notified of the dates for receiving their letters and submitting their application forms. They were received at the Internship Training Department office, where their application forms for the training year were reviewed to ensure they contained all the required information. The interns were then given their assignment letters. • All interns were monitored during their off-campus training via email and the university administration office. The training process was facilitated, and any problems encountered by interns, whether at Egyptian universities or Ministry of Health hospitals and centers, were resolved.
- Fifty-nine interns participated in the optional training period at the university, from the beginning of October until December 31, 2023.
- An infection control lecture was organized by Professor Maha Fathy for the interns before they began working at the university clinics.
- The interns' training schedule was arranged within the clinic complex, consisting of five working days per week for three months, with each month dedicated to a different specialty, according to the following schedule:

- An infection control lecture was organized by Dr. Mai Al-Qaffas, the Infection Control Officer at the University Clinics Complex, for interns before they entered the university clinics.
- The interns were divided into five groups, and tutors were assigned to each group to assist the internship training administration in monitoring the interns during patient treatment according to the Comprehensive Oral Therapy Program, answering any questions, assisting the interns, and serving as the liaison between the interns and the internship administration. 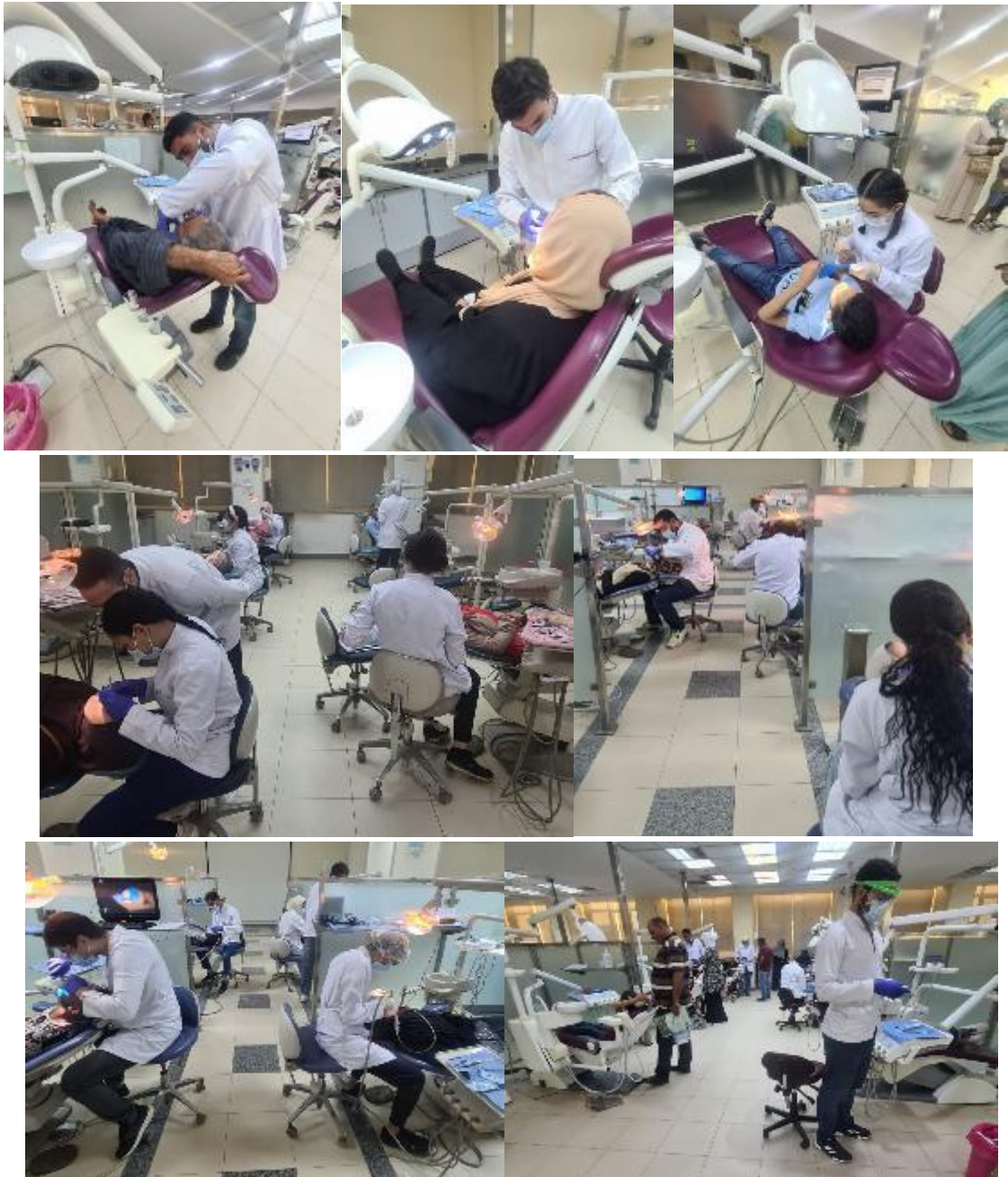
- Interns were monitored to ensure the constant presence of supervisors in the clinics and to verify the smooth operation of the training process.
- All complaints received from interns and supervisors across all academic departments were investigated, and appropriate decisions were made.
- An internship training program was established within the university's clinic complex for graduates from foreign countries. A Syrian graduate and a graduate of Istanbul Medipol University, Turkey, were accepted after fulfilling all legal procedures and passing the university's placement tests. The Supreme Council of Universities confirmed the equivalence of their Bachelor of Dental Surgery degrees awarded by Egyptian universities.

A special training program was developed for interns to complete their training within the university's clinic complex, starting June 1, 2024, for a full year. Upon completion, they will receive a certificate of completion for their internship year.

All attendees had the opportunity to apply all the steps in practice using different wavelengths of lasers.

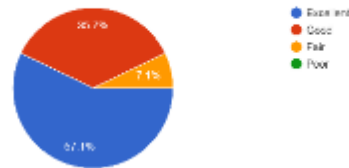

6. Workshop entitled "Dental Implants for Prosthodontics"

The Department of Removable Prosthodontics held a workshop for interns on Sunday, February 18, 2024, for 40 interns.

The theoretical aspect of the workshop was held in the Seminar Hall of the Intern Training Department on February 12, 2024, followed by practical training on February 15, 2024.

The stages of dental implant prosthodontics were reviewed from the initial step of planning for patients with complete or partial tooth loss, to the implementation of those plans and the placement of dental implants.

The importance of dental implant placement in the field of removable prosthodontics and treatment options for patients with no complete teeth was explained, as well as an introduction to the different sets of dental implants and the components needed to build the superstructure above dental implants.

The information needed for pre-implantation measurements was also highlighted and the use of CBCT and surgical evidence in the dental implant setting was also highlighted.

The concepts of dental occlusion and the central relationship recordings needed to build dental implant prostheses were explained to patients with partial or total tooth incapacity.

At the end, a practical workshop was held to apply the theoretical knowledge gained during the training course, and each trainee had the opportunity to perform dental implants practically within oral models.

- The work was organized within the clinic complex at the university to allow interns to attend all preparatory exams and simulation exams (Mock Exam – Simulation Exam) as well as consider the actual exam day as a holiday for all interns who will take the exam.

3. Activities of the Annual Scientific Day of the Intern Training Department

2. Field visit activities to Dar Al Yaqeen for Elderly Care in Obour

The Community Service and Environmental Development Committee at the College of Oral and Dental Medicine organized a field visit to Dar Al Yaqeen for Elderly Care in Obour on Wednesday, April 3, 2024. The visit included a group of distinguished doctors and faculty members at the college.

The aim of the visit was to educate residents, staff, and male and female caregivers regarding oral health and how to improve oral health care for the elderly.

During the visit, the franchise doctors presented the appropriate technique for cleaning teeth, in addition to the necessity of replacing missing teeth through the installation of dentures and the recommended methods for caring for these dentures.

The franchise doctors chatted with the elderly and took pictures with them throughout the visit, allowing them to ask all questions related to oral and dental health. 24 toothbrushes and toothpaste were distributed to inmates and caregivers. The home administration was also given various nutritional items upon their request.

They were informed of the possibility of free examination and treatment at the university's dental clinic complex, in addition to the college providing transportation service to and from the home for all male and female patients.

II. Basic Life Support and First Aid Course Program:

i. Basic Life Support (BLS) course program:

Description: BLS is the foundational course for healthcare professionals in prehospital and in-facility settings. BLS course trains participants to promptly recognize several life-threatening emergencies, give high-quality chest compressions, deliver appropriate ventilations using bag mask devices or advanced airways, provide early use of an AED and relieve airway obstruction (choking) in a safe, timely and effective manner. *BLS course is* a one-day session of 5 contact hours which focuses on two-rescuer scenarios and team-based approach resuscitation. The course reflects science and education from the American Heart Association Guidelines Update for CPR and Emergency Cardiovascular Care (ECC). The course reflects science and education from the American Heart Association 2020 Guidelines Update for CPR and Emergency Cardiovascular Care (ECC). The course is video-based with instructor-led discussion and simulation. An authorized AHA instructor observes students, provides feedback and refines BLS Skill techniques.

Expected course outcome:

- Know the AHA chain of survival.
- Recognize a victim in need of CPR.
- Perform high quality CPR for infants, children, and adults.
- Importance of early use of an Automated External Defibrillator (AED)
- Be an active member of any multi-rescuer CPR team.
- Relieve choking of any "foreign body air way obstruction"

III. International Implantology Program (MIU IIP)

International Implantology Program Batch #5 (2021/2023) started 11th of March 2021 and ended at 1st of September 2023. 25 candidates that were enrolled in the program are from different universities as Ain-Shams University, Future University in Egypt and Pharos University.

The MIU IIP International Implantology Program aims to familiarize the candidates with the required knowledge in the field of Oral Implantology from basic to advanced treatment modalities. In addition to educating the students on how they can design and perform treatment plans for implant placement cases, in partially edentulous sites, the program also educates the candidates how to plan and execute the restorative phase after the implants are functional. The candidates are taught how they can manage complications arising from dental implant placements. The program director is **Dr. Ahmed Aboul Fetouh** “Oral Medicine and Periodontology Department, MIU. Diplomat, American Board of Periodontology, Master Science in Periodontics-Tufts University – Boston, MA, USA. Department of Oral Implantology, MIU”. **Prof. Daniel Buser** “Professor and chairman of the department of Oral surgery and Stomatology, University of Bern, Switzerland (International Speaker)” is one of the visiting instructors for the program in addition to **Prof. Tarek Salah** “restorative department- fixed prosthodontics division, vice dean of post-graduate education and research”.

Training activities in scientific departments:

Within the framework of the implementation of the plan by the Faculty and Staff Development Committee, many scientific departments held lectures and workshops for their employees, which were:

• Department of prosthetics and properties of biomaterials

As part of the Department of Prosthetics and Properties of Biomaterials' efforts to implement the annual plan, practical training was given to the assistant staff who recently joined the department, through practical requirements for clinical cases of 3 patients with different conditions and laboratory requirements that are taught in the laboratories, and the requirements were evaluated by the department's faculty members.

Three theoretical and practical workshops were developed to train all faculty members and supporting staff in the department.

Prepared by Dr. Mahitab Hamdy, Lecturer of Industrial Prosthetics at the Faculty of Dentistry, Cairo University. It was implemented on Mondays and Wednesdays of every week during the period from 7/17 to 8/14, through a series of lectures and practical application covering the following topics:

1st course (Introduction to full mouth rehabilitation of complex cases)

2nd course (Digital prosthodontics)

3rd course (Prosthetic driven concept and implant planning) + hands on workshop

The training was coordinated by:

- Mr. Professor Doctor, Head of the Department of Prosthetics and Properties of Biomaterials.
- Mr. Doctor, Head of the Prosthetics Division.
- The committee responsible for training the department's assistants.



• Department of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery

As part of the Department of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery's efforts to develop the capabilities of its faculty and staff, it has undertaken several activities, namely:

1) The Department of Surgery conducted practical training for a medical team of assistant teachers and supporting staff in the academic year, fall 2023, for medical cases that require surgical intervention under the influence of general anesthesia, in an external educational hospital (armed forces) and under the supervision of the head of the department, in order to train the assistant teachers and supporting staff on how to deal with these cases in order to benefit from them in treating patients and for postgraduate studies to obtain various academic degrees in the specialty on March 2024 for a number of 6 assistant teachers. And the supporting body.



2) The Department of Surgery organized a special workshop to train intern doctors, and during the training, a team of assistant teachers and the supporting staff participated in how to deal with dental implant cases, conveying scientific and practical information through explanation, making a detailed description of the pathological condition on a simulator similar to the natural one, and applying this statement to a pathological condition that requires a dental implant operation, in the spring 2024 academic semester in September 2024, for 6 assistant teachers and the supporting

staff, and under the supervision of the professor. Dr. Head of the Department and Mr. Dr. Scientific Coordinator.



- 3) The Department of Oral Surgery will hold a workshop in the summer period of 2024 to train assistant teachers and assistant staff on the uses of computers and digital dentistry to treat surgical cases and diagnose cases that require surgical intervention, in preparation for its implementation in the academic year 2024-2025 to train and teach fifth-year students on the role of digital dentistry in various surgical interventions. Dated: 08/05/2024 until 08/14/2024, for 12 assistant teachers and the supporting staff.



• Division of fixed prosthodontics

1. On Thursday, February 8, 2024, a scientific meeting was organized entitled:

(E. Learning and Moodle handling and uploading files) The meeting was attended by fifteen members of the supporting body.



2. On Thursday, February 8, 2024, a scientific meeting was organized on quality work, including how to fill out quality files, teaching matrices, preparing course reports, and all documents required by the Quality Center. Twenty members of the supporting body attended the meeting.



3) On Sunday, September 10, 2023, a lecture entitled (Teaching assistants' calibration for preclinical practice in simulation labs) was organized. who in turn commented for public benefit. Twenty members of the supporting staff attended the lecture and evaluated each other anonymously regarding the “explanatory explanation for students”. An evaluation was made by the department’s faculty members, who in turn commented for public benefit. • Department of Oral Medicine, Periodontology, Diagnostics and Radiology

A capacity development plan for faculty members and supporting staff has been prepared to enhance the scientific knowledge and clinical skills of faculty members and their assistants, in preparation for the start of the graduate studies program in the coming period, which includes:

- Master in Cosmetic Dentistry.
- Master's in dental Implantology.
- Master's degree in periodontology.

This program has been developed to begin raising the level of scientific knowledge as well as clinical skills of faculty members and faculty assistants through the implementation of various advanced and conventional surgical procedures in the field of periodontology including the following:

- Dental implants - placement of immediate implants + GBR
- Raising the internal and external pockets
- Lengthening the crown functionally and aesthetically
- Treating receding gums

- Pigmentation treatment
- Gum regeneration
- Gingivectomy

The department's faculty assistants participated in these cases, and all surgical operations were performed under the supervision of the department's professors.

The Department of Oral Surgery conducted a workshop in the summer period of 2024 to train the assistant teachers and the supporting staff on the uses of computers and digital dentistry to treat surgical cases and diagnose cases that require surgical intervention, in preparation for its implementation in the academic year 2024-2025 to train and teach fifth-year students on the role of digital dentistry in various surgical interventions. 3. International Multidisciplinary Case Competition 2023 (I2C2)

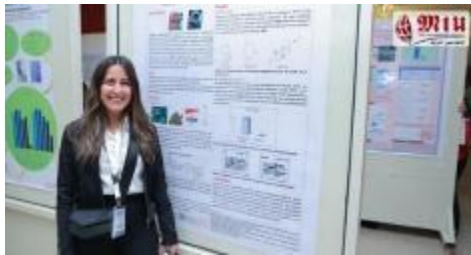

Cooperation agreements and memorandums

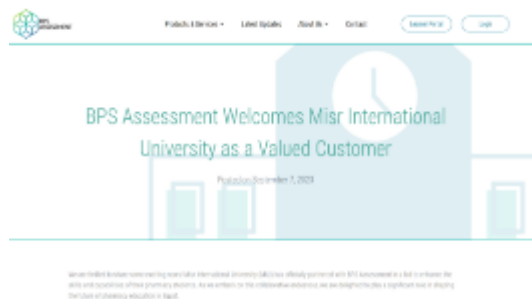
The college signed a number of memorandums of understanding with a number of agencies, hospitals, companies and pharmacies

Supporting small projects:

1. An exhibition of productive families to celebrate Ramadan and Mother's Day

Sixth: Awareness initiatives/activities

On October 14, 2023, coinciding with World Heart Day and World Sight Day, the college's Community Participation Development Committee organized an awareness campaign at the Obour Sports Club. 6 students and a faculty member participated in creating an awareness campaign about potential risk factors for cardiovascular diseases, and medications that may exacerbate cardiovascular diseases were also highlighted. During the campaign, light was also highlighted on the proper use of eye products and how to maintain them in appropriate storage conditions, while explaining ways to maintain eye health.



٢. The third drug safety week

From November 14 to 21, 2023, the College's Technical Support, Awareness and Training Committee organized the Third Medication Safety Week in cooperation with the International Society for Pharmacovigilance (ISOP) - Egypt Branch. 20 students from the fifth year participated in conducting an awareness campaign on the importance of pharmacovigilance and ways to report side effects of medications. On the sidelines of this event, a parallel awareness campaign was organized at Teachers Hospital, with the participation of college students, medical staff, and caregivers.

The event was attended by 30 children with cerebral palsy, accompanied by their families, in the presence of faculty members, supporting staff, and about 50 male and female students. During the event, the children celebrated, and the children presented their various talents. The children's families also presented stories of discovering the disease and how to deal with it. One of the supporting panel members also presented the success stories of some Arab and international public figures with cerebral palsy. On the sidelines of the event, 10 college students, under the supervision of faculty members, provided pharmaceutical advice to the children’s parents regarding the medications that the children use using the college’s resources.



٤. Awareness campaign about antibiotic resistance

On February 26, 2024, the Faculty of Pharmacy at Misr International University, in cooperation with the Community Participation Development Committee and the Microbiology Department, launched an awareness campaign on campus about antibiotic resistance. The campaign aimed to reduce the development and spread of antibiotic-resistant infections by educating the community about the misuse and overuse of antibiotics. 34 male and female students from the college participated in the campaign under the supervision of faculty members to raise awareness among university employees and students from various majors.

5. Cooperation with the Medicine for All Charity Foundation

This initiative was conducted in cooperation with the Medicine for All Charity Foundation, which received and sorted the medications for distribution to patients in need under its responsibility and appropriate medical supervision.

6. Heart Failure Awareness Campaign Entitled "Discover the Undiscovered"

From April 18 to May 8, 2024, 23 students from the fourth and fifth years of the Faculty of Pharmacy, Misr International University, participated in an awareness campaign for heart failure patients. The Faculty's Community Engagement Development Committee supervised the participating students in the campaign, which was organized by the European Society of Cardiology under the auspices of the Egyptian Society of Cardiology.



7. Breast Cancer Awareness Activity

On April 24, 2024, ten students from the Faculty of Pharmacy at Misr International University, in collaboration with the student organization DIMAS, conducted an awareness activity about breast cancer. The activity included an educational lecture for 40 women from Abu Kabir Center in Sharqia Governorate, explaining methods and techniques for early breast cancer detection. During the lecture, attendees were also informed about the services offered by Hospice Egypt, which provides medical, moral, psychological, and financial support to cancer patients, particularly those in advanced stages.



8. Hypertension Awareness Campaign at Al-Zohour Sports Club

On May 24, 2024, the Community Engagement Development Committee at the Faculty of Pharmacy, in coordination with the student organization DIMAS, organized an awareness campaign about hypertension at Al-Zohour Club's Fifth Settlement branch. Students from the Faculty conducted an awareness session for club members about high blood pressure. The campaign included free blood pressure checks and interactive educational activities for children, highlighting lifestyle changes to mitigate the risks associated with the disease.



9. Collaboration with Education First

In collaboration with Education First, starting in July 2024, the Pharmaceutical Technology Department, headed by Professor Hani Mahmoud, began reviewing the theoretical and practical curricula of the Bank Misr Pharmaceutical Industries School, affiliated with Education First. The Bank Misr Pharmaceutical Industries School is an international applied technology school with a three-year program that graduates pharmaceutical technicians.

Seventh: Activities of the DIMAS Student Club

1. Joint Campaign with Parkville on Various Hair Problems

On October 4, 2023, the DIMAS Student Club, in collaboration with Parkville, organized a joint campaign at the university campus addressing various hair problems that can affect both men and women. The company provided students with the necessary medical information and distributed free samples to students and faculty members throughout the day.



2. Sanofi Influenza Vaccine Awareness Seminar for Students and Staff

On October 23, 2023, the student club “DIMAS,” in collaboration with Sanofi Pharmaceuticals, held a seminar on influenza, the types of vaccines available, and the importance of vaccination, especially for those most vulnerable to influenza complications. The seminar was presented at the university campus by Dr. Amr El-Desouky, the company's Medical Director, and was attended by 95 students. On the sidelines of the seminar, the company offered vaccines at discounted prices to university students and staff.

During the campaign, students and faculty members were offered discounts on the company's products and gym memberships.



5. Awareness Campaign in Partnership with Parkville Egypt

In collaboration with Parkville Egypt, DIMAS students organized a promotional and awareness campaign from February 11th to 18th, 2024, to promote Parkville Egypt products and the skin conditions they address. The campaign included activities for students and members of the Parkville Learning Center, providing medical advice on the use of these products and distributing some products to students and faculty. A dermatology clinic was set up in the main university building in cooperation with Groovy Clinics to diagnose skin diseases and problems for students and faculty members and dispense appropriate treatment using Starville products free of charge. An awareness campaign was also conducted on the importance of using collagen for joint diseases. Coordination was made with Farghali Fresh Juices on campus to distribute free collagen-infused drinks to promote the product and its benefits. Free yoga sessions were also held by specialists in the field for students and faculty members interested in trying it. Finally, recreational competitions were held for students, and prizes were distributed to the winners.



6. Collaboration with the Egyptian Red Crescent to Organize a Blood Donation Campaign

On April 15th and 16th, 2024, members of the DIMAS student activity organized a blood donation campaign in collaboration with the Faculty of Pharmacy at the university and the Egyptian Red Crescent. The campaign aimed to raise awareness about the importance of blood donation as a social responsibility that can save thousands of lives. The campaign began with a social media campaign promoting different blood types and donation eligibility criteria. A comprehensive health assessment was conducted for the donors. At the end of the event, the Egyptian Red Crescent collected a total of 129 units of blood from students, faculty members, and university staff.

Third: Faculty of Alsun and Mass Communication

1- Training for all segments of society

First: Activities undertaken in the Fall 2023 semester

First objective: To raise awareness among faculty and staff about community service and environmental development issues and activities

1. A seminar was held for students of the Media Department on Thursday, November 23, 2023, on the importance of community service activities and their potential contributions in generating new ideas and implementing informational posters for various awareness campaigns in the areas of climate and safe driving. Sixty-one students from the Media Department attended this seminar.

2. A seminar was held for students of the Languages Department on Tuesday, October 3, 2023, to raise awareness about available community activities and to allow them to register their names and the activities they wish to participate in this year. Fifty students from the Languages Department attended this seminar.

3. A seminar was held for students of the Media Department on Wednesday, February 21, 2024, on the importance of community service activities and their potential contribution to generating new ideas and producing documentaries for various awareness campaigns in different fields. Sixty-eight students from the Media Department attended this seminar.

4. A seminar was held for students of the Languages Department on Thursday, February 22, 2024, to raise awareness about available community activities and to allow them to register their names and the activities they wish to participate in this year. Seventy students from the Languages Department attended the seminar.

Invitation to External Speakers:

1. The Faculty of Alsun and Mass Communication at Misr International University held an awareness seminar entitled "**Youth Gains in Light of the National Human Rights Strategy**" as part of the Community Service and Environmental Development Committee's activity plan for the first semester of the 2023/2024 academic year.

- The seminar was delivered by Professor Mohamed Mamdouh, President of the Egyptian Youth Council, member of the National Council for Human Rights, and supervisor of publications from the National Dialogue Observatory, on Wednesday, November 15, 2023. Students and some faculty members and teaching assistants from the Departments of Alsun and Mass Communication attended.

- Mr. Mamdouh emphasized that human rights refer to a set of principles concerned with equality, justice, and ensuring a life free from fear, discrimination, or harassment. These principles have all been among the top priorities of the current Egyptian government.

- He also discussed the gains achieved by the government in various sectors over the past few years, particularly regarding the rights of youth, women, and people with disabilities. Furthermore, he highlighted how the economic reform program has contributed to promoting development, providing job opportunities for young people, and establishing partnerships between the government and the private sector to advance the Sustainable Development Goals.

- The organization of the workshop underscores the college's commitment to promoting inclusive education that equips students with practical life skills.

Second Objective: Increasing the College and its Staff Participation in Community Service and Environmental Development Activities

1. As part of the faculty's efforts in community service and environmental development, the Department of Media at the Faculty of Alsun and Mass Communication, Misr International University, visited **the VeryNile Initiative** headquarters on Tuesday, November 14, 2023, accompanied by nine female students from the Media Department.

- The Very Nile Initiative is an initiative for the Nile and its fishermen. The visit aimed to introduce the students to the initiative's various activities, including cleaning the Nile River of solid waste and protecting its waters from pollution, recycling solid waste, reducing the use of single-use plastics, and raising our students' awareness of the importance of environmental protection.
- Mr. Ahmed Hatem, Logistics Manager, led the students on a tour of VeryNile's facilities, emphasizing that VeryNile is developing sustainable methods for cleaning the Nile, recycling plastic bottle caps into reusable plastic sheets, and repurposing plastic into attractive products such as bags, wallets, and hats in various styles. He also highlighted VeryNile's efforts to empower marginalized fishing communities through an environmentally friendly process of collecting recyclable waste from the Nile in exchange for financial incentives.
- Following the tour, the students attended two workshops:
 - The first environmental workshop was led by Ms. Amna Karamallah, an advocacy and awareness trainee. She provided the students with valuable information about the Nile River and its sources, beach clean-up operations, plastic pollution, and various awareness activities.
 - In the second environmental workshop, the students participated in a hands-on recycling experience, creating their own wallets from recycled plastic waste and taking them home. Some photos from the visit are included below.

Two workshops were conducted for the girls residing at the orphanage, who are in preparatory and secondary school, as well as attending institutes, as follows:

- Heidi Wael, a teaching assistant in the Media Department, presented the first workshop on e-marketing, providing effective guidelines for creating, designing, and managing paid advertising campaigns on Facebook. The workshop also aimed to empower participants to find and target customers online for the products they manufacture, such as handbags and carpets.
- Nadine Nassef, a teaching assistant in the Languages Department, presented the second workshop, which addressed common nutritional and health terms used in daily life in both English and Arabic (such as expiration dates, food ingredients, calories, etc.). Each participant was given three types of snacks with nutritional labels to practice reading health and nutritional terms as instructed during the workshop. • The Community Service Committee distributed posters designed by media students to raise awareness about environmental issues such as tree planting, air pollution, and plastic-free drinking bottles. They also distributed brochures containing important food terms in both English and Arabic, designed by the Department of Languages, and art supplies for the girls at the orphanage.
- The directors and officials of the orphanage praised the visit and expressed their appreciation to the members of the Community Service Committee at the college and MIU University for organizing these beneficial workshops. 6. Media students from the IMC 242 Advertising Design & Layout course designed and produced informational posters to raise environmental awareness, focusing on water conservation, preserving the Nile River, avoiding plastic use, and promoting agriculture to purify the air. 7. A student from the Radio and Television program in the Media Department produced a video about the correct way to yield to ambulances, in cooperation with the Egyptian Ambulance Authority, to establish a cooperation agreement between the two entities.

8. Students from the Languages Department completed a graduation project aimed at raising awareness among parents and teachers about the stages of language learning and teaching from childhood. This was achieved through online resources, videos, and interactive games, and the project will be presented to teachers in public schools and English language centers.

The posters also highlighted the importance of preserving a clean environment.

11. Students enrolled in the Linguistics Topics course in the Department of Languages designed educational and recreational materials for students of Al-Ghad Al-Mushriq School for Special Needs as part of the course requirements. These materials were presented to the school during a field visit by the students on May 12, 2024.

12. Students from the Departments of Alsun and Mass Communication designed graduation projects aimed at serving the community. For example, Languages students designed websites illustrating the stages of language acquisition and including interactive activities for learning English. Media students produced four **documentaries** related to community service as part of the AVP471 – Documentaries course. These documentaries are:

- Rowing Champions at the Paralympic Games
- Al-Amal Academy for the Mentally Disabled
- Plastic in the Nile and the Very Nile Initiative
- Scooters and Electric Bicycles as Environmentally Friendly Alternative Transportation.

Students from the Media Department also completed graduation projects aimed at serving the community, as follows:

Marketing Communications Department Graduation Projects:

1. Parental Burnout – A Break and We'll Continue. This campaign helps parents overcome burnout. It focuses on raising awareness among parents and newlyweds about all aspects of parental burnout and providing them with strategies to deal with it effectively.

2. Athletes' Mental Health – Jump the Barrier. This campaign equips athletes with the mental tools they need to succeed, focusing on the mental challenges they face alongside physical training. It emphasizes the importance of mental strength and provides a roadmap for overcoming these challenges. The campaign also addresses the stigma surrounding mental health in sports and encourages athletes to seek help and prioritize their mental well-being.

3. Post Cancer Journey – We Continue with You. This campaign aims to bridge the gap between cancer survivors and their support systems during the post-treatment phase by adopting a positive approach. It emphasizes that the journey is not over for survivors and that their families and friends play a crucial role in completing what remains unfinished.

٤. Pet Mating and Adopting (Pawfect) – Owning a pet is a rewarding experience, but pet owners often face challenges in meeting their pets' needs, especially when it comes to finding a companion or adopter. Pawfect Match aims to solve this problem through a dedicated app that connects pet owners, creating a hassle-free community.

٥. Extracurricular Activities – Extra Time. This campaign aims to educate young people about the importance of children's educational programs, emphasizing non-academic skills and providing diverse opportunities to encourage participation.

٦. Echo-Fem – Short for "Eco-Feminism," this campaign emphasizes women's participation in environmental issues. "Echo" represents eco-friendly practices and amplified women's voices. The campaign aims to reduce environmental risks by leveraging women's voices and power to stimulate and inspire change in their communities.

V. Orphans Stigma – Orphans are safe. Orphans often face social stigma and a lack of support. Integrating them into society through acceptance by the target audience (TA) can provide stability and help them become the best versions of themselves. The campaign raises awareness about the challenges orphans face and the pivotal role society can play in providing them with opportunities through a consistent and ongoing approach, along with collaboration with NGOs and ministries to amplify the message.

The **Radio and Television Department's graduation projects** were as follows:

١. Humanization: A film about environmentally friendly buildings. This documentary explores the concept of public architecture by investigating three different architectural spaces: a cultural center, a home, and a tourist area. The dialogue between function, sustainability, landscape, and the overall human experience unfolds through an audiovisual architectural journey that prioritizes people and respects their culture and surrounding resources.

٢. 100 Men. This documentary highlights the lives of women in Egypt who work in unusual and often challenging jobs. These women break stereotypes and societal expectations by entering male-dominated fields and face discrimination and obstacles in their daily lives.

3. Made in Egypt. This documentary explores the growing trend of consumer support for local brands. Marketing professionals and local brand owners delve into the reasons why people are increasingly choosing local companies over mainstream giants. The film highlights the unique character, quality, and community focus that local brands offer. With the help of Corona, Spirospatis, and Khotwa, we were able to understand each brand's story, from its beginnings to how it has evolved and continues to develop every day!

٤. Against the Sun... Like the Moon. This documentary aims to explore the experiences and perspectives of individuals living with albinism across different social classes in Egypt. Due to a lack of public awareness about albinism, people with this condition often face racism and harassment from a young age. This documentary presents five cases, each representing a different age, social, and economic background, and the pros and cons of living with albinism, as well as how these individuals cope with the ongoing discrimination they face throughout their lives. By sharing these diverse perspectives, the documentary aims to shed light on the realities of living with albinism and promote greater understanding and acceptance within Egyptian society.

5. Golden Dwellings. This documentary tells the story of a beekeeper and her bees, showcasing their close bond and the beekeeper's dedication. It focuses on the importance of the queen bee and what the beekeeper learns from her. It covers how bees make honey and royal jelly, their defense against predators and human threats, and corrects the misconception that bees are dangerous. The film includes a quote from Albert Einstein about the importance of bees. Through beautiful footage and stories, it highlights the crucial role of bees in nature.

٦. A Chair + Law - A Constitution. In this experimental documentary, students explore the daily lives, basic activities, and struggles of wheelchair users in Egypt. From simply getting around, using public transportation, going to cafes, and navigating the streets, to accessing healthcare facilities and exploring community life, the film examines the situations they encounter and delves into the details to determine whether Egyptian laws concerning wheelchair users are enforceable.

"Spirit." This film focuses on Hospital 57357 and the role of the hospital's art department in supporting the psychological well-being of the children being treated there.

Fourth: Faculty of Engineering

Introduction:

The Faculty of Engineering Sciences and Arts at Misr International University enhances the scientific and practical role of its two academic departments (Architecture and Communications) and maximizes the university's role in serving the community and its surrounding area, as well as serving regions and communities outside the university's geographical scope. This is achieved through participatory scientific courses such as design courses, design methodologies and scientific research courses, urban design courses, and courses on human factors in design, among others. Through these courses, the institution diversifies its educational and service activities aimed at environmental development and community service, addressing the community's needs and priorities.

This report addresses the implementation of the objectives of the Community Service Action Plan for the academic year 2023-2024, covering the period from September 1, 2023, to January 31, 2024.

This was accomplished by emphasizing three strategic pillars:

- ١- Encouraging university activities in various community and environmental fields, enabling graduates to acquire scientific and practical skills and experience for community participation in development activities required by the labor market.
2. Building continuous communication channels with the community through the college's projects and programs.
- 3- Enhancing the college's scientific and practical role in serving the community and its surrounding area.

The plan's objectives were:

First Objective: Awareness

Second Objective: Communication and Interaction

Third Objective: Research, Experimentation, and Application

During the Fall 2023 semester.

1. Type of Participation:

Raising awareness among students and staff about the importance of environmental conservation and community service through a series of lectures.

ASCC For Help

The student club held several events throughout the semester:

- Opening
- Member's Booth
- Delegate's Booth
- Orientation session conducted by supervisors to guide new delegates.

The ASCC For Help student club held several events both on and off campus throughout the semester under the supervision of Dr. Mohamed El-Sawy, Vice Dean of the Faculty of Engineering for Community Service and Environmental Affairs. The activities included:

1- Case Study and Winter Exhibition

A case study of over 150 homes in Fayoum, specifically in the village of Youssef El-Siddiq, was conducted on November 24, 2023. After reviewing the case studies, it was discovered that the most vulnerable group needed assistance in the following areas:

- 1- Housing: Roof construction, wall repairs, and provision of winter blankets.
- 2- Clothing: School uniforms for children, a winter exhibition, and a summer exhibition.
- 3- Health: The group most affected by asthma and slipped discs.
- 4- Awareness: Awareness campaigns about... The harms of child marriage, brushing teeth, and wearing shoes
- 5- Food: Distributing Ramadan food baskets, daily meals, and meat.

A plan was indeed developed to implement what was mentioned in the research. A winter clothing exhibition was held, and more than 100 pieces of clothing were distributed at the beginning of the academic year on November 24, 2023.

2- Distributing blankets: Based on the case study and donations, 250 blankets were distributed in Fayoum, in the village of Salem Gad, on December 22, 2023.

3- Distributing external books to the children of the orphanage:

Donations were collected to purchase external books for the children of Dar Al-Huda Islamic at the beginning of the academic year on November 22, 2023. The donations were collected by the students to purchase books for the first semester, estimated at 8,000 Egyptian pounds, and for the second semester, estimated at 16,000 Egyptian pounds.

The children received their books for the first semester on November 22, 2023.

The children received their books for the second semester on February 17, 2024.

4- Preparing Ramadan food baskets:

This was done in cooperation with the Dr. Hassan Abbas Zaki Association. In Cairo, 150 Ramadan food boxes were prepared and distributed by the association on March 5, 2024.

5- Communication and Interaction:

Architecture students participated in the “Land Building Workshop in Luxor” during the mid-year break. The workshop was supervised by Dr. Tamer Awni, Eng. Radwa El-Fardi, Eng. Hadi Gamal, and Eng. Hassan Ayman, in collaboration with MUD Studio, under the direction of architect Mohamed Tantawy.

During the workshop, students gained practical experience in using sustainable building techniques and locally sourced materials. They worked on constructing arches and vaults using traditional mud bricks. They also attended lectures by distinguished instructors to learn about various types and techniques of arches and domes.

The students also had the opportunity to visit Luxor's famous temples and explore the heritage of Hassan Fathy's village. They also visited Esna and enjoyed learning through experience.

This workshop is part of the department's efforts to enrich students' experiences and explore architectural practices. Sustainable.

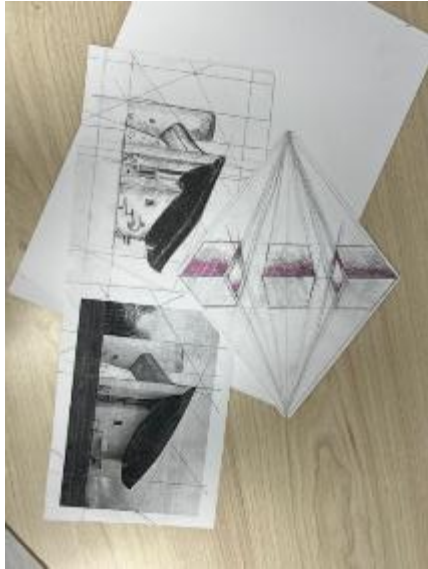

In July 2024, the Department of Architecture conducted a training program for 30 high school students, preparing them for admission to art and architecture colleges. The training covered the use of tools and perspective drawing techniques, as well as basic technical and artistic theories such as the color wheel and geometric projections. Students were also prepared for aptitude tests.



In July 2024, the Faculty organized a series of field trips to visit Islamic monuments in Old Cairo. These trips introduced students to historical houses, their design principles, the materials used in their construction, their relationship to the surrounding environment, and their natural ventilation. Visits included Beit El-Suhaymi, the Prince Taz Palace, and the Mawlawi Hall.



Also in July 2024, the Faculty organized a series of field trips to the Grand Egyptian Museum. Students explored the Egyptian artifacts on display and learned about the museum's distinctive architectural design.



The Architecture Department organized a workshop in July 2024 to train students from Ain Shams University on the use of plastic bricks made from recycled materials. The workshop, which included students from the university, focused on architectural design and construction to scale, familiarizing them with architectural details and required design dimensions.



Fifth: Faculty of Information and Computer Science

Introduction:

Community engagement and environmental development are key components of the vision and mission of the Faculty of Information and Computer Science. The vision for community engagement is for the faculty to play an active technological role in solving real problems within Egyptian society.

First:

Believing in the university's role in serving the community and developing the environment, and especially the Faculty of Computer Science and Information's contribution to spreading awareness and culture among various segments of society and contributing to raising the level and efficiency of human resources in society to overcome all obstacles and barriers to keeping pace with the times and obtaining greater opportunities in the job market, donations were made to the Orman Association – Central Administration for the Faculty of Computer Science at its headquarters in Kafr El Gabal, Giza.

Secondly:

Computer literacy for adults and children is essential in this era to keep pace with educational and professional development across all segments of society. Based on this premise, a visit was made to the Fatima Al-Zahraa Orphanage in its location in Gesr El-Suez, Cairo, to prepare the children for employment and integration into civil society by training them in the use of essential computer applications.

Eng. Haitham Abu Bakr delivered a lecture on how to use Microsoft Word. The response, interaction, and practical training were outstanding, despite the orphanage's limited resources. The students recommended holding several more sessions soon, God willing.

The training course was divided into two parts:

1. Theoretical Part:

This part included two lectures on using word processing software, along with practical examples.

2. Practical Part:

This part involved practical training for the students in a computer lab at a school attached to the orphanage, where they applied the concepts in a hands-on manner.

Third:

Graduation projects were directed towards community service and environmental development. Students were encouraged to direct their graduation projects towards serving the community and developing the surrounding environment.

The College's Community Service and Environmental Development Committee ensured that at least 60% of graduation projects served the community and industry.

We also aim to provide free training lectures in various fields for university students to help them develop their professional skills. Student volunteers are now preparing Ramadan food baskets and

assisting the neediest families in Cairo and the Delta governorates. This initiative follows the approval of our esteemed university administration to place two donation boxes on campus. Student volunteers are preparing the food baskets and collecting donations from their families and friends to prepare the baskets themselves and distribute them to the neediest families, based on a prior assessment of the situation in the village specified in the application.

Activity Objectives:

To assist the neediest families in Atfih by providing Ramadan food baskets and other food baskets.

Activity No. (7): Distributing food aid and conducting a case study on homeless people in the entire Nasr City district of Cairo Governorate.

Activity Description: We are a student activity that aims to help the needy and impoverished homeless and to develop Egyptian society. We also aim to provide free training lectures in various fields to university students to help them develop their professional skills. The report details the student initiative to distribute food aid, including canned and preserved foods, to the most vulnerable segment of Egyptian society: the homeless in the Nasr City district of Cairo. It's worth noting that the student activity "Kayan" is the first student initiative at an Egyptian university dedicated to supporting and sheltering the homeless. The student members prepare the food aid and collect donations from their families and friends to pack the bags themselves.

The initiative's objectives are: • To assist the most vulnerable group, the homeless, in the Nasr City district of Cairo Governorate, by conducting a comprehensive case study of the area, identifying every homeless person, and distributing food bags to them in the following areas: Salah Salem, Nasr Road, Mustafa El Nahhas, Zakir Hussein, Al Mithaq, Al Fangari Street, Al Tayaran Street, Abbas, Al Nozha, Makram Ebeid, Children's Park, Hassan Mamoun, Al Taqa Street, Al Tabba, Ezbet El Haggana, the Tenth District, Zahraa Nasr City, Al Waha, Al Wafaa Wal Amal, the cemetery area, and all other neighborhoods and streets of Nasr City.

Achieving the following Sustainable Development Goals:

Activity and Event Details:

The student activity members gathered at 8:00 AM on April 26, 2024, in front of the main gate of Al-Ahly Club in Nasr City. The students boarded university buses, which facilitated transportation within Nasr City, enabling them to search for homeless individuals, move around easily, and distribute food baskets. The club president delivered a motivational lecture to the activity members, preparing them for the day's activities. Activity leaders answered members' questions, aided, and guided them throughout the event. The participating members were then divided into teams of four: one student for photography, two for searching for homeless individuals in the area, and one for distributing and speaking with those in need. The students used two buses for easy transportation within Nasr City, allowing for a comprehensive assessment of the area and distribution to as many homeless individuals as possible in East and West Nasr City, including areas within the First and Second Nasr City Police Stations. Sadly, we witnessed scenes even more harrowing than we could have imagined about our homeless families. The first case involved a simple family of three children and a helpless father and mother who had found no shelter for themselves and their children except under a dark, isolated bridge, surrounded by garbage, stray dogs, and cats. The students were able to identify the family when they noticed two children, no older than fifteen, playing on a highway bridge, isolated from other people. They asked them where they slept, and they replied, "Here, in the street." A conversation ensued between the activity members and the two children, Mo'men and Ahmed: "Where are your father and mother, Mo'men?" "Mo'men: They're here, under the bridge." "Can we see them?" "Mo'men: Come here, Daddy, Mommy!" And here was the heartbreaking scene under a bridge on the Suez Road leading to Nasr City, a highway bridge whose depths showed no sign of human life, with no light or air entering. The father, mother, and middle son were sitting there, and the students spoke with the head of the family, Uncle Sayed. Uncle Sayed told us that he works odd jobs, sometimes finding work and sometimes not.

Poverty and debt have left him and his family homeless. The most painful thing for his children was the separation from their older brother, who was imprisoned on some charge. The mother wept when she saw us, overwhelmed with sadness and distress over her situation. The students helped the family by providing them with food and a food basket, and by locating them so they could help again. This was just one example of the first case that the student activity members were able to find and assist. The students encountered many other cases throughout the day: a young, educated man with dreams, but no home; a woman who was the head of her household; someone who had left his village and town and become homeless to escape harm from others; and other heartbreaking situations that bring tears to the eyes and deepen the sorrow in the heart. The common thread in all the homeless cases we contacted was family. We found a son homeless because of his parents, a homeless grandfather, and someone who had fled the injustice of his brothers trying to seize his inheritance. We found people traumatized by their children, and others in similar situations. Poverty wasn't the sole cause of homelessness; family problems and psychological trauma were often the biggest contributors, even more so than poverty itself. We ask God to forgive and have mercy on us all, and to make us a source of help to others in this world.

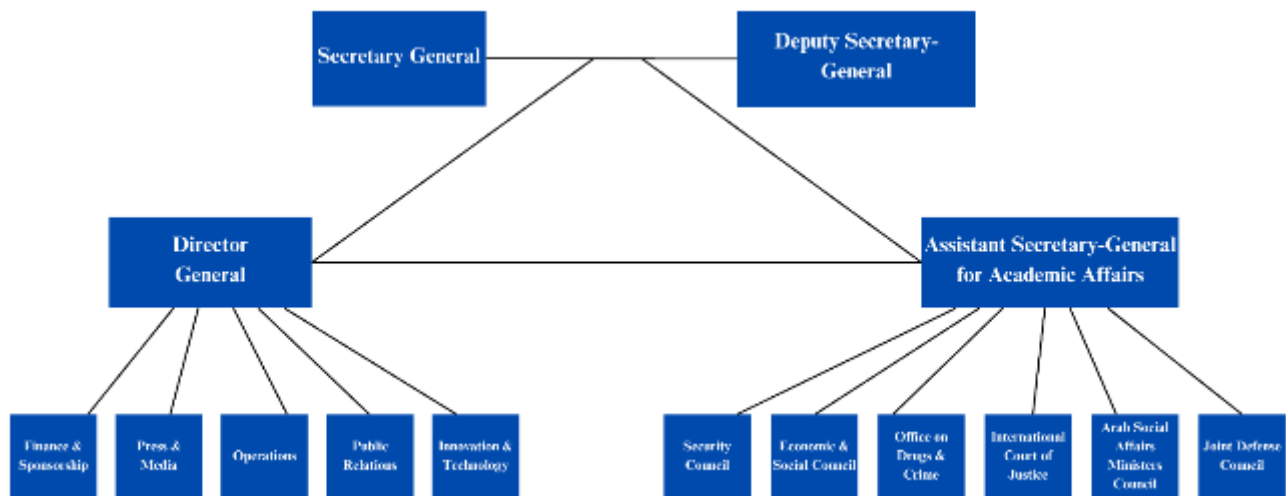
Activity Title: "Activity Sessions and Conference Simulating the Councils of the United Nations and the League of Arab States"

Activity Description:

The activity sessions provide an interactive space to discuss and clarify the working mechanisms of the United Nations and the League of Arab States. The aim is to provide a deeper understanding of various surrounding issues at the local and global levels and to prepare activity participants for the conference held at the end of the year, which simulates the two organizations underpinning the activity. The conference, in turn, is an application of skills learned throughout the year, combined with essential information about the two organizations, to find innovative solutions to the problems facing the world and the Arab states. This aligns with the provisions of the Charter of the United Nations and the League of Arab States and implements the Sustainable Development Goals. This year's simulation model consists of six sections: four for the United Nations model and two for the League of Arab States model.

Finally, the simulation model is divided into two committees:

1. The Academic Committee, which oversees the six model councils.
2. The Organizing Committee, under which the five organizational councils of the model fall.

1. United Nations Security Council
2. United Nations Economic and Social Council
3. International Court of Justice
4. United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime

Report on the 2024 Model United Nations and League of Arab States Academic Committee Sessions

Model United Nations Councils:

United Nations Security Council

Session 1:

Session Objective: To highlight the importance of the concept of security and stability, the history and establishment of the Security Council, its most important tasks, and to provide real-world examples and models of its role within the United Nations.

Session Content:

1. Defining the concept of security, and the origins of the United Nations and the Security Council in particular.
2. Defining the veto power, the countries that possess it, and the basis for their selection.
3. Security Council resolutions and interventions in the following conflicts: the Korean War (1950-1953), the United States and the Soviet Union, and Chinese interventions; the events in Libya in 2011 and the Security Council's efforts to resolve them; the conflicts in Cyprus; the conflicts in the Congo and Resolution 143.
4. The beginnings of peacekeeping forces and the United Nations Regional Office for Central Africa.
5. Interactive Activity: Narrating the story of the Nigerian Civil War (1967-1970) and whether the United Nations, specifically the Security Council, could have intervened to resolve this conflict.

Second Session:

Session Objective: To narrate the history of the Cold War, how it began, and to explain the United Nations Security Council's definition of war and how it has changed to the present day.

Session Content:

1. A recounting of the events of World War I and II.
2. The story of Hiroshima and Nagasaki and the atomic bombs dropped on them.
3. The basics of nuclear bomb manufacturing and its components.
