Misr International University (MIU) was ranked among the most prestigious universities in the world, according to the Times Higher Education (THE) impact rankings.



Evaluation of Impact Ranking of MIU 2019/2020 and 2020/2021

Aspiring to attain recognition on the global academic stage and enhance its influence as a source for positive change, MIU has participated in the Times Higher Education Impact Rankings. This report is intended to evaluate the university's performance in addressing the UN SDGs, It also offering recommendations for enhancement, with the overarching goal of securing a higher ranking in the international academic landscape.




Figure 1. Number and distribution of Egyptian universities participating in THE Rankings from 2019/2020 to 2020/2021





Improvement in MIU Total Score and Rank through the years 2019/2020 to 2020/2021




Figure 2. Improvement in MIU overall score in THE Rankings 2019/2020 to 2020/2021

MIU achieved a total score of 57.9 out of 100 in THE Rankings for 2019/2020. This score increased to 58.9 in 2020/2021, reflecting an improvement of 1.7% (Figure 2).

In the 2019/2020 rankings, the university held the position of 601-800 among 1406 universities. In the 2020/2021 rankings, MIU secured a position of 801-1000 out of 1591 universities (Table 1).




Figure 3. Performance of MIU in different SDGs 2019/2020 to 2020/2021






SDG 1 (No Poverty)

SDG 1 consists of four metrics. In 2020/2021 ranking, the university has improved in one metric. The total score is reduced by 18.7% from 2019/2020 to 2020/2021 (Figure 4).

The university has improved in all metrics of SDG 3. The improvement in the total score is 5.7% from 2019/2020 to 2020/2021 (Figure 5).





Figure 6. Performance of SDC 4 in impact rankings 2019/2020 to 2020/2021

The university didn't show improvement in all metrics of SDG 4. The total score is reduced by 16% from 2019/2020 to 2020/2021 (Figure 6).

The university showed slight improvement in two metrics in addition to the total score. The university has no first-generation female students. The improvement in the total score is 1.2% (Figure 7).





The university showed an improvement in three metrics in addition to the total score. The improvement in the total score is 10.4% (Figure 8).



Figur e 9. Performance of SDG 8 in impact rankdnas 2019/2020 to 2020/202






Firmre 11. Performance of SDG 11 in imports rankings 2019/2020 to 2020/2021




Figure 13. Performance of SDC 16 in in randongs 2019/2020 to 2020/2021




Figure 14. Performance of SDG 17 in impact rankings 2019/2020 to 2020/2021

- 4. Teaching: how far the courses offered by universities are relevant to the specific SDGs.




Benchmarking the Publication Year and Scholarly Output

MIU Dental Clinics Complex: Free Services for All September 2021 - December 2022

The Dental Clinics Complex (DCC) at the Faculty of Oral and Dental Medicine – Misr International University (MIU) provides all dental services for free regardless of patients' gender, socioeconomic status, color, race, religion, or nationality. Services include medical examination, checking blood pressure, blood glucose level as well as referral for medical specialists when necessary. DCC applies all measures of prevention and control of infection according to the guidelines of the American Dental Association (ADA) and Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). Since the announcement of COVID-19 pandemic; the DCC applied all preventive measures recommended by the World Health Organization (WHO) and other international health organizations.

This report highlights the services provided for different categories of patients through the period September 2021 to December 2022.





1. Distribution of patients according to geographical location, frequency of visits and poverty rates:




Figure 1. Patients' distribution according to geographical locations and frequency of visits from September 2021 to December 2022

The university is settled in Qalyubia governorate; however, it serves patients from all Egyptian governorates. From September 2021 to December 2022, DCC served (20209) new patients and (88435) recurring patients as well as (23) patients from MIU staff. Those patients belong to Qalyubia, Cairo, Giza, Sharqia and Dakahlia governorates. The Central Agency for Public Mobilization and Statistics (CAPMAS) in 2018 reported the poverty rates in these governorates to be 20.1, 31.1, 34, 24.3 and 15.2%, respectively. Patients from Cairo, Qalyubia and Sharqia represented the largest number of patients with high frequency of visits which reflects the university's role in providing free health services to community sectors with high poverty rates (Figure 1).

2. Non-Egyptian patients including refugees:

The DCC offers its services to all nationalities without discrimination. However, during this reported period, none of the patients was non-Egyptian.

3. Patients' distribution according to gender:

The DCC serves patients from both genders without discrimination. The distribution is presented in (Figure 2) and the male: female ratio was 1: 1.22.

4. Patients' distribution according to age categories:

The DCC serves pediatric as well as adult patients' dental treatment. Distribution of patients according to age categories is presented in (Figure 3).

5. Serving medically compromised patients:




Figure 4. Patients' medical condition from September 2021 to December 2022

The DCC applies Access to Care policy which guarantees that every new patient must have medical examination in the first visit. Recurring patients are checked regularly, and medical examination results are documented in the patients' medical records. Medical examination is carried out by professional medical teams and there is a Code Blue team for dealing with any emergencies. Medical conditions of new patients from September 2021 to December 2022 are presented in (Figure 4). It is worth noting that hypertension was the most common medical condition.

Summary

Generally, there is improvement in MIU total score and rank. It was placed within the band of 801-1000 according to Times Higher Education rankings. MIU achieved a total score of 57.9 out of 100 in THE Rankings for 2019/2020. This score increased to 58.9 in 2020/2021, reflecting an improvement of 1.7%.

In the 2019/2020 rankings, the university held the position of 601-800 among 1406 universities. In the 2020/2021 rankings, MIU secured a position of 801-1000 out of 1591 universities. This is not to be taken as an indication of a decline in the contributions of MIU towards the SDGs, but rather is due to the increased number of universities participating in the ranking.

Amidst the ever-changing scene of global education, MIU continues its progress and journey to excellence. The university's dedicated efforts are reflected in the enhancement of its total score and rank, according to the Times Higher Education rankings. It secured a commendable position within the band of 801-1000. In the 2019/2020 rankings, MIU attained a total score of 57.9 out of 100, marking a noteworthy ascent to 58.9 in 2020/2021—an improvement of 1.7%.





Summary (Cont.)

The university actively tackled 11 goals within THE Impact Ranking, and an analysis of the scores revealed significant improvements in SDG3, SDG 5, SDG 6, SDG 8, SDG 10, SDG 11, and SDG 16. Conversely, there was a decline in scores for SDG 1, SDG 4, SDG 12, and SDG 17.

Notably, the university held the position of 601-800 among 1406 universities in the 2019/2020 rankings, which evolved to 801-1000 out of 1591 universities in the subsequent year. It is important to highlight that this change of rank is not indicative of a decline in MIU's contributions to the UN SDGs but rather reflects the increased participation of universities in the ranking, affirming MIU's position among a growing academic landscape.

What follows is a summary of the efforts exerted by MIU within the four pillars- the framework adopted by Times Higher Education.

It has been noticed that the scholarly community at MIU focuses on publishing in national journals. The high costs of international publishing, particularly in light of Egypt's economic hardships could be among the main factor limiting the international contributions of the university staff. To encourage more international participation, further financial incentives are needed. Moreover, recognizing their pivotal role in raising health awareness, MIU researchers have paid considerable attention to conduct studies on COVID-19.





Summary (Cont.)

Notable attention has also been directed towards research in computer science, dentistry, and pharmacy. The majority of scholarly output addresses SDG 3 (Good Health and Well Being).

As for Stewardship, a wide array of events was hosted by MIU within the timeframe outlined in this report. These events included academic seminars, ranking awareness sessions, ceremonies honoring athletes and talented students, and recreational events such as bazaars and Iftar gatherings for employees.

Regarding outreach, there is a significant increase in outreach programs. During the academic year 21-22, many visits have been organized to underprivileged communities and people with special needs facilities, orphanages, and houses of the elderly. The disappearance of the covid-19 pandemic has encouraged such events.

There has been a significant increase in outreach initiatives and programs. Throughout the academic year 2021-2022, numerous visits were arranged to underprivileged communities, facilities catering to people with special needs, orphans, and the elderly. The relief from the COVID-19 pandemic has spurred the organization of these events.

Numerous workshops and scientific gatherings have been organized in collaboration with esteemed institutions, fostering an environment of continuous improvement and innovation. Partnership agreements with industry hold paramount importance for MIU. They allow students to apply the knowledge they gain in the classroom in real-world settings and increase their employability upon graduation.

This summary reveals that MIU's commitment to excellence extends beyond its present achievements. The following section lists a number of recommendations and suggestions for improvement that the university aims to implement in order to consolidate its global rank and reputation.





Recommendations & Future Plans

Recognizing the significance of formulating a performance enhancement plan for continued success, MIU is keen on adopting innovative ideas aimed at strengthening its position as a global institution that contributes to building a sustainable future. Following is a number of recommendations and suggestions that can help the university achieve its mission as a community-concerned institution:

- Make the best use of the university's website, and social media posts to highlight achievements, and share information/news about ranking.
- 2. Conduct workshops to educate the university's staff about the importance of rankings, and the role each member plays towards attaining a higher score.
- 3. Encourage collaborations with international institutions to enhance the university's global reputation.

- 4. Acknowledge and honor faculty's research contributions that positively influence rankings.
- 5. Create effective communication channels with stakeholders to gather insights on how to enhance ranking performance.
