➤ The university participated in the individual athletics events at the 53rd Martyr Al-Rifai Republic University Championship, held at the American University in Cairo and Cairo Stadium on Sunday, Monday, and Tuesday, January 28-30, 2026. The university was represented by two male and one female student from the Faculties of Dentistry, Business Administration, and Mass Communication. **The results were as follows:** a female student from the Faculty of Mass Communication won two gold medals in the 100m hurdles and long jump; a male student from the Faculty of Dentistry won a gold medal in the hammer throw; and a male student from the Faculty of Business Administration achieved fourth place in the javelin throw.

The preliminary round was held, with the first match taking place on Sunday, November 16, 2025, against the Chinese University, resulting in a 43-32 victory for the Chinese University. The second match was on Monday, November 17, 2025, against Future University, resulting in a 42-32 victory for the Chinese University. The third match was on Tuesday, November 18, 2025, against Al-Ahram Canadian University, resulting in a 20-0 victory for the Egyptian International University. The results of the first round saw the Egyptian International University team finish second in their group and not advance to the final round, as only the first-place team progresses.
- The university's women's basketball team participated in the Martyr Al-Rifai 53 Republic University Championship. The preliminary round was held, with the first match on Tuesday, November 18, 2025, against the German International University, resulting in a 54-13 victory for Misr International University. The second match was on Wednesday, November 19, 2025, against Benha University, resulting in a 58-49 victory for Misr International University. The third match was on Thursday, November 20, 2025, against October University for Science and Technology, resulting in a 46-22 victory for Misr International University. The results of the first round saw Misr International University finish first in their group and advance to the final rounds. The final rounds were held, and the first match was on Tuesday, December 2, 2025, with Sinai University, where the result was a victory for Misr International University over Sinai University with a score of 59/24. The second match was on Wednesday, May 3, 2025, with October University for Science, where the result was a victory for Misr International University over October University for Science with a score of 22/15. The third match was on Thursday, December 4, 2025, with Higher Education, where the result was a victory for Misr International University over Higher Education with a score of 44/37. The results of the final rounds resulted in Misr International University winning first place and the gold medal.

The activity focused on understanding:

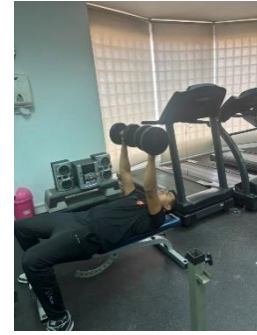
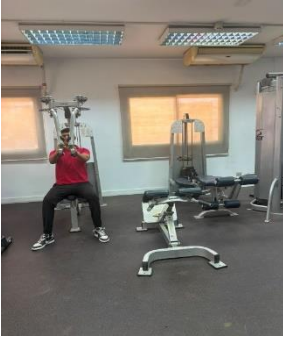

Aims include organizing regular visits to senior homes and community centers, offering companionship, assisting with daily tasks (e.g., technology tutoring, errands), and raising awareness about elder abuse and loneliness. The club

also documents oral histories to preserve cultural heritage and instills values of empathy, respect, and social responsibility.

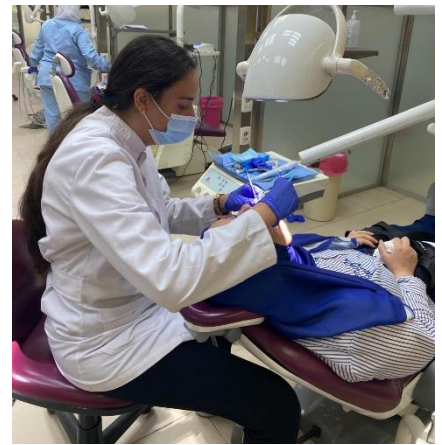

- On the sidelines of World Oral Health Day, The Elderly Club participate with the Community Service and Environmental Development Committee at the Faculty of Oral and Dental Medicine organized a field visit to Dar Al-Yaqeen Elderly Care Home on Sunday, February 23, 2025, to raise awareness about maintaining oral and dental health and to present some gifts.
  - The visit was attended by the Vice Dean for Community Service and Environmental Development, the Director of the Internship Training Department, a faculty member from the Conservative Dentistry Department, two members of the Internship Training Department staff, and 11 dental interns. During the visit, the interns demonstrated the proper way to clean teeth, maintain oral and dental health, and care for dental prosthetics.
  - An awareness session was conducted for the fifteen residents of the home, as well as the supervisors, on how to maintain oral and dental health. Fifteen toothbrushes, toothpaste, and other gifts were distributed to the residents and supervisors. They were also invited to receive free dental examinations and treatment in all specialties at the university's dental clinic complex.
  - Questionnaires were distributed to the supervisors to identify their oral and dental health needs, evaluate the visit, and measure their satisfaction. The satisfaction rate was 100%.
  - Another questionnaire was distributed to the resident physicians and other participants in the visit to evaluate it, and their satisfaction rate was also 100%.





- On the sidelines of World Oral Health Day, The Elderly Club participated with the Community Service and Environmental Development Department at the Faculty of Dentistry organized an event inviting residents of the Al-Nour Wal-Amal Association for Elderly Blind Women to the university's clinics complex on Sunday, February 23, 2025, & August 12, 2025, for oral and dental examinations and treatment.
- Seven resident physicians examined eleven female patients and three companions, providing the necessary medical services within the university's outpatient clinic complex. This was done under the supervision of the Vice Dean for Community Service and Environmental Development, the clinic's supervisor, faculty members and their assistants from various scientific disciplines, and in the presence of members of the Community Service and Environmental Development Committee.
- At the end of the visit, questionnaires were distributed to the association's supervisors and the patients' companions to evaluate the visit and the patients' satisfaction with the services provided.
- The satisfaction rate with the medical services provided was 100%.



## 16. Podcast Club

## 17. AI (Artificial Intelligence) Club

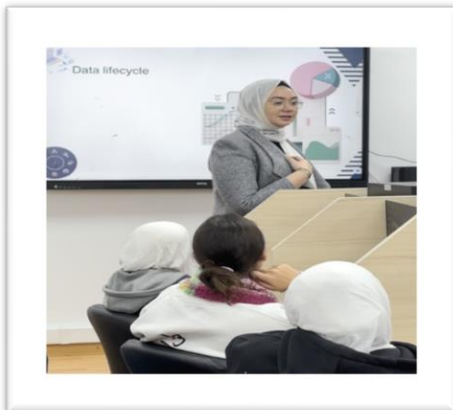

The aim was to introduce students to the technological tools that support interactive and immersive exhibition experiences.



- The club participated with the Faculty of Information and Computers in organizing a scientific seminar in cooperation with the National Committee for Artificial Intelligence Sciences. The distinguished scientific seminar was entitled:

“Artificial Intelligence and How to Obtain Funding for Scientific Research” on May 27, 2026, in the presence of His Excellency Professor Dr. Mahmoud Abdel-Aty, Chairman of the Committee, and one of the most prominent scientists specializing in the fields of artificial intelligence, quantum computing and neural networks.

The symposium addressed the latest global trends in artificial intelligence and its role in supporting scientific research and innovation. It also reviewed mechanisms and opportunities for funding promising scientific projects and research, contributing to enhancing research capabilities and supporting researchers and students.

The event was attended by Professor. Ahmed Emad, Vice President of the University for Education and Student Affairs, Dr. Ayman Nabil, Dean of the Faculty of Information and Computer Science, along with faculty members, researchers, and students.

## 18. Cybersecurity Club

The Cybersecurity Club is established to promote awareness, knowledge, and best practices related to digital security and information protection. The club seeks to create a community of students interested in understanding cybersecurity challenges, emerging threats, and strategies for safeguarding digital assets.

The club provides opportunities for students to explore topics such as cyber defense, ethical hacking, digital privacy, risk management, and secure computing environments.

By encouraging responsible digital citizenship and security awareness, the Cybersecurity Club aims to prepare students to navigate an increasingly connected world with confidence and competence.

- A joint cooperation protocol was established between the Egyptian Computer Emergency Readiness Team (EG-CERT) and Misr International University (MIU). This national center operates around the clock, monitoring cybersecurity, responding to incidents, analyzing digital evidence, analyzing malware, and performing reverse engineering. The center's main objective is to enhance the security of Egypt's communications and information infrastructure by taking proactive measures, collecting and analyzing information related to security incidents, coordinating between stakeholders in resolving these security incidents, and cooperating internationally with other computer emergency response teams in other countries.
- The club has built strategic partnerships with industry sectors and enhanced the technical competence of students through specialized workshops. It conducted an awareness and recruitment campaign (Microsoft Club Pavilion) for four days between October 5-8, 2025. The target group was all university students from different colleges and academic years.

The main activities included the following:

- Microsoft Imagine Cup: Introducing students to this global competition and how to participate.
- Membership Recruitment: Conducting in-person interviews at the club headquarters for students interested in joining specific sections.
- Student Interaction: Organizing icebreaker games to foster communication and build relationships.
- Professional Conduct: Ensuring the wing operates according to strict guidelines regarding respect and standards of conduct.

The club held its official opening ceremony on November 12, 2025, in strategic partnership with Orange Business. This event helped bridge the gap between academic studies and the expectations of businesses. There were enriching panel discussions led by specialists from Orange Business, covering topics such as networking, cybersecurity, artificial intelligence, and real-world incident management. Students gained in-depth insights into the business sector and built a professional network within the leading university club.

Other key activities took place on November 19, November 26, December 1, December 3, and December 10, 2025, including:

1. User Interface Development Course (3 sessions): A course in user interface development covering the fundamentals of web design, including HTML, CSS, and JavaScript.
2. GitHub Workshop (1 session): Version control using GitHub: Introducing students to the Git workflow, repository management, and collaborative programming practices.
3. Launching Software Development (1 session): An introductory session that introduced the software development team, explained their work processes, and provided an overview of software development.

These sessions aimed at equipping students with practical, work-ready technical skills, enabling them to build their own projects and contribute effectively to open-source programs.



## 19. Freelancing Hub Club

The Freelancing Hub serves as a platform for students interested in the collection, analysis, interpretation, and visualization of data to support informed decision-making and innovation.

The club aims to cultivate analytical thinking and data literacy by introducing members to the principles of data science, statistical analysis, predictive modeling, and business intelligence. 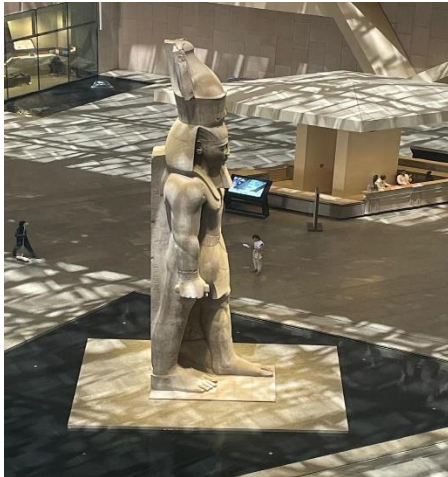
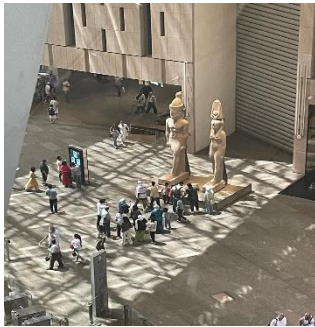
## 21. Explore Egypt Club
